To whom it may concern,

A 36-month experimental license, as opposed to a 24-month experimental license, is requested to provide the time necessary to design, manufacture, test, and optimize the design of the medical implant RF transceiver. Because the medical implant telemetry system will undergo extensive testing in patient's homes, medical clinics, physician's offices, and hospitals, scheduling the testing and obtaining the necessary approvals for testing at these facilities can be time consuming, and can add significant delay to the development effort. Also, since the testing of the RF telemetry link will be performed in conjunction with the development and testing of the therapeutic functions of the implant, which are expected to take a similar amount of time, a 36-month experimental license is requested.

At the expiration of the experimental license (if approved), the transceivers will be disabled, and any implants that are implanted in humans will be removed.
