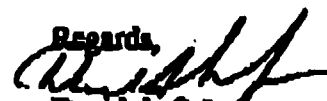

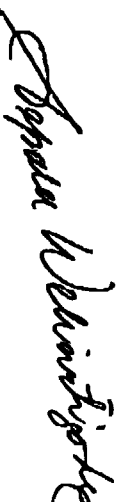
Dear Ms. Sylvia:

This letter is submitted with regard to our request for special temporary authority, dated September 24, 1996, to provide services to one INMARSAT-B terminal to be operated by Mission Research Corporation. In our request for special temporary authority, we stated that Mission Research wishes to use the subject terminal for communications from remote locations where no alternative means of communications exist.
