Mr. Kennedy,

Pursuant to our telephone conversation this morning, this is to confirm that Motorola does not propose to use aeronautical mobiles (for example on helicopters or other aircraft) as part of its experimentation. It has also reviewed Section 2.106 footnote US311 of the FCC's rules and has determined that its proposed operations on 4940-4990 MHz using mobiles at a maximum of 5 watts ERP will not cause interference to radio astronomy observatories. Motorola has calculated that the free space loss is 147 dB for the closest observatory, which is approximately 190 km to the west of Motorola's proposed area of operation.

Thanks for your help with this matter.
