Warren,

Yesterday, our Miami Florida office reported to me that they were receiving radio interference on our repeater that receives on 407.725 MHz and transmits on 415.050 MHz which is located at the Del Rico Tower communications site. Our office telephoned Industrial Communications at 305 770-9991 and requested that their technicians determine the cause of our interference.

On March 11, 1999, I was advised that the offending transmitter was operating on a frequency of 407.95 MHz. Our records indicate that in January of this year we experienced the same problem and the source of the interference was a transmitter owned and operated by Motorola. The last time this happened one of our Postal Inspectors in Miami was in a high speed pursuit and the radio interference rendered our radio system useless.

I respectfully request that the FCC license for 407.95 MHz assigned to Motorola, Ft Lauderdale Florida to develop radio communications equipment in the 406 - 420 MHz band be immediately suspended. Their use of this frequency is an extreme hazard to our Postal Inspectors in the Miami area that are charged with federal law enforcement duties.
