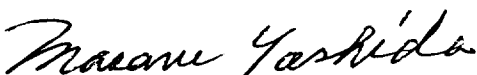
For broadcasters, it is very important to secure communications in news gathering. Under the emergency circumstances, there is no alternative communication.

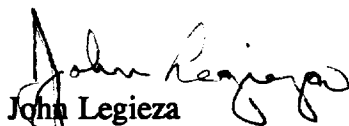
