Re: Application of Oceus Networks for a Special Temporary Authority, File No. 0544-EX-ST-2014

Dear Ms. Dortch:

The First Responder Network Authority ("FirstNet") consents to the application of Oceus Networks ("Oceus") for Special Temporary Authority to demonstrate Long Term Evolution communications equipment in the 758-768/788-798 MHz band. The proposed STA would support product demonstrations at the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center in New Orleans during the Association of Public Safety Communications Officials International convention for the period of August 2 to August 6, 2014. The transmission range will be limited to within the booth and its immediate vicinity.

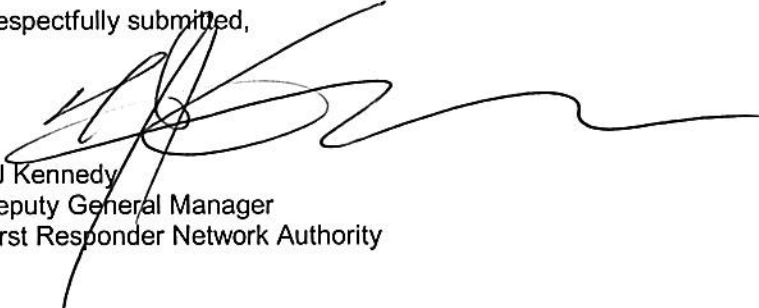
FirstNet's concurrence is premised on the demonstration operations that conform to the following parameters:

- 1) Transmissions utilizing Oceus Networks, Motorola Solutions, Inc. and Ericsson AB equipment will be performed for product demonstration purposes.
- 2) Oceus requests authority from the Federal Communications Commission ("Commission") to operate over the 758-768/788-798 MHz bands, which are currently licensed on a nationwide basis to FirstNet.
- 3) Operation will begin when the Commission grants the requested license and will begin August 2, 2014 and be completed on August 6, 2014.
- 4) Operation of the equipment will not be used in mission-critical operations or in the delivery of live transmissions in duties to protect life, property, or safety.
- 5) Oceus recognizes that its experimental operations will be secondary and must not cause interference to any operations licensed to FirstNet. Oceus further understands that any primary operations have no obligation to mitigate interference to the experimental operations.

- 7) Oceus understands that an experimental license only permits shared use of the subject radio frequencies and that it may have to coordinate with other entities licensed for experimental purposes.

FirstNet concurs with the proposed experimental license for Oceus on certain frequencies currently licensed to FirstNet for purposes of demonstration and testing as described above. This consent is subject to the FirstNet's ongoing ability to monitor any operations and use of FirstNet's licensed spectrum.
