Special Conditions:

- (2) Operation of a GPS re-radiating signal device must meet the following conditions:
 1. Authorization is for indoor use only
 2. The device is to be used as an Experimental RNSS Test Equipment for the purpose of testing RNSS equipment/systems
 3. The area of potential interference to GPS reception (e.g., military or contractor facility) has to be under the control of the user.
 4. The maximum equivalent isotropically radiated power (EIRP) must be such that the calculated emissions are no greater than -140 dBm/24 MHz as received by an isotropic antenna at a distance of 100 feet (30 meters) from the building where the test is being conducted
 5. GPS users in the area of potential interference to GPS reception must be notified that GPS information may be impacted for periods of time.
 6. A "Stop Buzzer" point of contact for the authorized device must be identified and available at all times during GPS re-radiation operation of the device under any condition.
