

Question 50 Exhibit

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) previously provided a statement and explanation regarding the circumstances of its felony convictions, as well as a Letter supplementing its character analysis.¹ The cited Exhibit was included in a Form 608 filing.² The filing was accepted on May 19, 2023.

PG&E will continue to provide relevant updates in its annual reports, which are filed in response to a condition imposed by the FCC.³

On May 31, 2023, the Shasta County Superior Court granted the Shasta County District Attorney’s motion to dismiss the 2020 Zogg Fire criminal case pending against PG&E. The Shasta County District Attorney and PG&E also announced that the parties had reached a civil agreement. Under the terms of the agreement, PG&E committed to continue several initiatives to further reduce the risk of wildfires; to fund \$45 million in contributions to numerous organizations dedicated to rebuilding and assisting Shasta County communities impacted by the fire; and to pay a \$5 million civil penalty to the County. The Shasta County Superior Court approved the civil settlement on June 9, 2023.
