Pursuant to FCC Part 15 subpart 15.7, Philips Consumer Electronics Company is requesting that the Commission authorize a special temporary authority (STA) for Philips to conduct onsite RF radiated immunity measurements on a commercial machine located at the manufacturers location in Akron Ohio. The manufacturer of this machine, **Glasstech, Inc.** is contracting Philips to conduct on-site RF immunity testing on their equipment to show compliance with European EMC regulations. (IEC 1000-4-3).

Philips Consumer Electronics Company is requesting a STA to transmit RF energy at the maximum allowable EPR (watts) in the following frequency band:

80 MHz through 1.0 GHz
80% AM modulated with a 1KHz sinewave
Both horizontal and vertical antenna polarization

Philips would like to perform these tests **November 02, 1999 through January 02, 2000** between the hours of 06:00 AM to 12:00 PM.



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The length of time to conduct this test is normally only one day, however; many times these machines do not pass this test and further testing is required following a modification of the machine. Depending on the nature of the modification the time between re-tests could be up to three months.
