Dear Dick:

On behalf of our client, Alma Vision Hispanic Network, Inc. ("AlmaVision"), licensee of Low Power Television Station K55KD (NTSC Channel 55), Van Nuys, California, this is to respond to the letter of January 17, 2007 from your client, Qualcomm, Incorporated ("Qualcomm") to AlmaVision, requesting K55KD to immediately cease operations on Channel 55 due to actual interference caused by such operations to Qualcomm's 700 MHz wireless operations currently being tested in the Los Angeles area.

As was explained to you in our telephone conversations yesterday, and as reiterated below, AlmaVision needs a few additional days to wind up the operations of Station K55KD on Channel 55. In this connection, AlmaVision requests that Qualcomm take no action against AlmaVision or seek relief before the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), and if Qualcomm forbears, AlmaVision will cease operations on Channel 55 no later than 9:00 pm Pacific Standard Time on Monday, January 29, 2007, and will not return to that channel in the future, as we agreed.

AlmaVision requests Qualcomm's indulgence to keep K55KD operational on Channel 55 through January 29 because AlmaVision wishes to make as smooth a transition as possible in the relocation of K55KD to another channel. In that connection, a request for special temporary authority ("STA") for K55KD to operate on a new channel was filed with the FCC this morning. We intend to request expedited processing of the STA request in the hope that it can be granted by the FCC staff by next Monday.

In addition, a few more days of operations on Channel 55 is critical to assist AlmaVision in notifying its audience of the new channel that K55KD will operate on. AlmaVision is a not-for-profit, Spanish-language religious ministry, which does not have a substantial advertising budget. Thus, AlmaVision wishes to use its own air-time on K55KD, rather than print ads or other

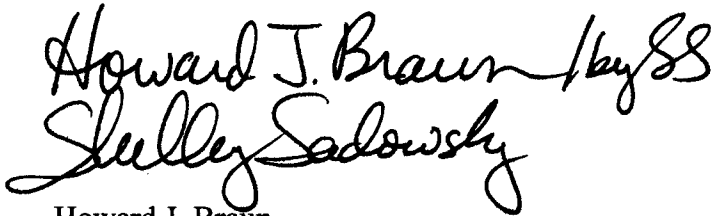
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advertising methods, to notify its audience about the channel change. And, if it can make such announcements on Channel 55 until the evening of January 29, 2007, AlmaVision believes that a substantial segment of its audience will learn of the channel change, and the harm to its audience will be mitigated.

In sum, AlmaVision, with Qualcomm's indulgence, commits to terminating its broadcast operations on Channel 55 on January 29, and not returning to that channel in the future. We believe the request for additional time to operate on Channel 55 is reasonable in that it should allow enough time for AlmaVision to transition to a new channel pursuant to FCC prior consent, educate its audience about the transition and not force AlmaVision to devote limited financial resources to other modes of advertising the channel change.

Please let us know whether the foregoing is acceptable to Qualcomm.
