Hi Carl-

As for the purpose of operation for 0109-EX-ST-2004 per our phone conversation:

"A new Omni system will be commercially deployed in the future across the Continental US, Alaska, Hawaii, and US Territories. The system must be tested in all of the satellite coverage areas to verify performance quality."

On file 0109-EX-ST-2004, I've confirmed that the Boatracs system can only be used with about 100 miles of the coast, and is restricted by the satellite's beam. The actual distances varies with the geographic location. Based on this, do you feel that this STA can also be absorbed into file 0045-EX-ST-2004 providing the STA includes the surrounding waters?
