Bob, as we discussed on the phone we are looking at new wideband data terminals which could be used with the various Ka-Band satellites in the next few years. The work we will be doing this spring is the modification of an ACTS terminal to support data rates up to 155mbps with a 29.65GHz up link and a 19.925GHz down link. Since we will be unable to reach the ACTS satellite due to limited power we would like to fly a bent pipe on a small aircraft to support our testing. We plan to apply for an experimental license to support our testing in the Ka-Band and would appreciate your support via a letter to Raytheon Systems. We would coordinate before each test and during the test period to assure that our testing did not cause a problem with users of the ACTS satellite. We would provide your letter along with our application for experimental license to show the FCC our intention to coordinate our test with the ACTS program office and their users.

Eventually, we would like to have sufficient power to use the ACTS satellite but that is some time in the future pending success of our initial test.

We would like to apply for the experimental license in the next couple of weeks. Your timely response would help us meet that schedule.
