Special Conditions:

- (1) Operation is subject to prior coordination with affected Educational Broadband Service/Broadband Radio Service (EBS/BRS) licensees.
- (2) This frequency assignment in one of the bands 1435-1525, 2310-2320 and 2345-2390 MHz was coordinated prior to authorization with the Area Frequency Coordinator, Ft. Huachuca, AZ, who also coordinated it, as appropriate, with the Aerospace and Flight Test Radio Coordinating Council. Use of this frequency under the authority of this assignment is subject to such further coordination with the AFC, Ft. Huachuca, as necessary to ensure compatibility with existing uses.
- (3) Licensee is required to coordinate operations with existing microwave users in the area to avoid interference.
- (4) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (5) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (6) Operation is subject to prior coordination with the local Society of Broadcast Engineers, Inc. (SBE) frequency coordinator. Consult the list at https://www.sbe.org/sections/freq_local.php to find the appropriate coordinator.
- (7) Experimental station shall use the minimum power level necessary to establish communications links to minimize potential interference to licensed users.
- (8) Stop buzzer point of contact is Ernest Gossmann at (520) 794-0227.
- (9) Operations in the WCS bands (2312-2320 MHz and 2345-2507 MHz) must comply with the emission limits applicable to those bands. See 47 C.F.R. § 27.53(a).
- (10) Operations in the 2483-2500 MHz band must be in compliance with the coordination agreements reached between the Licensee and Globalstar.
- (11) UASs authorized herein must not be used for air traffic control communications.
- (12) The authorized station must be in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements as set forth in Section 17.4 of the Commission's Rules.
- (13) This authorization is without prejudice to any determination that the Commission may make regarding pending or future experimental satellite earth station applications.
- (14) Prior to commencing any operations in WCS (2305-2320 MHz/2345-2360 MHz) frequencies, the applicant must obtain consent from the WCS licensee (AT&T).
