Message:

You state in one of your exhibits that "Soundtronics anticipates obtaining long-term experimental authority to operate in the 944-952 MHz band in early 2016 but requests interim authorization to operate in this band to commence experiments pursuant to the authorization described above." This seems to violate the Filing Guidelines for Experimental Special Temporary Authorization on the first screen of the STA filing application: "1) STAs are intended for experiments that will last no longer than six months. Applicants intending to conduct experiments of longer duration should file for a regular experimental license using FCC Form 442. 2) Applications for STAs are generally processed on a first come, first served basis along with regular applications and should be filed well in advance (at least 30-60 days, if possible) of the desired start day." Double-filing is strongly discouraged by the Experimental Licensing Branch. The review process is basically the same for an STA and a 442. Explain why this STA application should not be dismissed and refiled on Form 442.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of January 08, 2016 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.
