Dear Mr. Wright:

The enclosed check and FCC Forms are submitted to obtain an Experimental Radio Station Authorization under part 5 of the Rules.

As explained, reference (d), this license is required to operate a new T/CAS Ramp Test device which, in addition to currently licensed Radionavigation Land Test (RLT) frequencies, operates on 1090 MHz, for which there are no provisions under Part 87 of the Rules. This equipment will be used to perform the system tests required for Initial and Follow-On Certification of aircraft as defined in FAA Advisory Circular Number 20-131 (Airworthiness and Operational Approval of Traffic Alert and Collision Avoidance Systems (T/CAS II) and Mode S Transponders), RTCA D.O. 185, and ARINC 735.

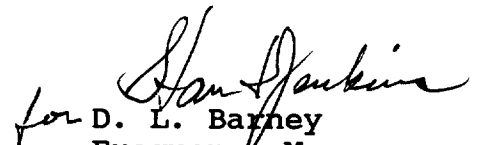
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We advised the FAA T/CAS Program office, reference (b), of the need to have the FCC Rules changed to permit the operation of T/CAS Ramp Testers on 1090 MHz. We also advised them of our intention to apply for this license as an interim measure to keep The Boeing Company T/CAS program milestones in keeping with those specified in the FAA Circular.

As recommended, reference (c), we pre-coordinated this application, with Pete Holst, FAA Northwest Mountain Region, reference (a), and obtained his preliminary verbal concurrence.

In order to meet the first certification test date, we must have a license granted no later than October 1, 1990. Failure to have this license in place by this date will severely impact the Company's ability to meet the FAA mandated quota of T/CAS equipped and certified aircraft.
