Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (3) Operation must be maintain separation from the incumbent, grandfathered fixed satellite service earth stations as defined in Part 90, Subpart Z.
- (4) Ensure that the proposed experimental operation will not cause harmful interference to any existing registered stations using the 3650-3700 MHz band and notify registered users in the area.
- (5) Operation is subject to prior coordination with Fixed Point to Point and Multiple Address System licensees in the immediate area.
- (6) Licensee must coordinate with other users as necessary to minimize interference.
- (7) The Stop Buzzer, Mr. Andy Kopito, 310-364-7209 (phone) and 310-994-2735 (cell) must be available during testing to terminate transmissions if interference occurs.
- (8) Prior to activation, licensee must coordinate with Western Area Frequency Coordinator (760) 939-6832/6948.
