Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (3) Experimental use is secondary to and must not interfere with Flight Test operations.
- (4) Use of these frequencies is not exclusive. Multiple users are licensed for these frequencies in the same geographic area. Transmission on any given frequency in California may be subject to day-to-day, hour-by-hour scheduling with the Los Angeles Area Flight Test Radio Coordinating Committee. POC's are:

- (5) Boeing must coordinate with other users as necessary to minimize interference.
- (6) Renewal of this License is subject to prior coordination with AFTRCC Frequency Advisory Committee, www.aftfcc.org
- (7) Operation is NOT PERMITTED using the frequency bands:
 - 406-406.1 MHz
 - 410.275-410.325 MHz
 - 1164-1189 MHz
 - 1215-1240 MHz
 - 1559-1610 MHz
 - 4200-4400 MHz
 - 5000-5030 MHz
 - 5091-5150 MHz.
- (8) This frequency assign was coordinated prior to authorize with FAA headquarters, 800 Independence Avenue, S.W. Washington, DC 20591. Phone 202-267-8699.
- (9) Use of this frequency or band under the authority of this assign is subject to further coordination with the WAFC, as necessary to ensure compatibility with the existing uses.
- (10) Periodic testing to ensure integrity of RF shielded room at Boeing facility.
- (11) Most testing conducted inside of chamber.

Special Conditions:

- (13) Operation using the frequency bands 128.825-132 MHz and 136.5-136.975 MHz is subject to prior coordination with Aviation Spectrum Resources Inc. (ASRI).
- (14) Applicant agrees that project limited to testing, experimentation or trial and may not involve live-duty operations by first responders or others to protect life, property, or safety.
- (15) Applicant agrees that any press release to be issued regarding the STA/EL, surrounding demonstration, or use of Band 14 spectrum relating to the STA/EL must be coordinated with and receive written signoff from FirstNet prior to release (POCs: ryan.oremland@firstnet.gov and peter.tomczak@firstnet.gov).
- (16) Applicant certifies that the Governor-appointed FirstNet Single Point of Contact within the proposed STA/EL location has been notified of STA application (contact information available at www.firstnet.gov/consultation).
- (17) Applicant must accept interference from any other user of Band 14 and must coordinate operation with other authorized Band 14 STAs/ELs. Failure to effectively coordinate shall result in immediate suspension of STA until such time, as determined by FirstNet, that project may continue.
- (18) Applicant must not cause interference to FirstNet operations or those approved to operate in Band 14 per license (i.e. public safety entities licensed to operate on Band 14). Failure to effectively coordinate shall result in FirstNet requesting that the FCC immediately suspend the STA. Reinstitution of the STA would require re-coordination with FirstNet.
- (19) Applicant certifies that it has verified with reasonable supporting detail no current potential for interference with FirstNet operations or those approved to operate in Band 14 per STA/EL or license (i.e. public safety entities licensed to operate on Band 14).
- (20) POC must be established and sent to FirstNet upon STA approval with "kill switch" authority; Applicant agrees to immediately cease operations as directed by FirstNet upon receipt (in any form and for any reason) of notification to kill switch POC until such time, as determined by FirstNet, that project may continue.
