- (2) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.

- (4) Prior to operation, licensee must coordinate with stations authorized to operate in these frequency bands that are located within a within a 25 mile radius of the transmitter.

- (5) Boeing must be aware that the frequency range 14700 -15000 MHz is internationally allocated to Radio Astronomy on a secondary basis s. US footnote 203,US footnote 342 and note 5.149 in the table of allocations require that all practicable efforts be made to protect Radio Astronomy observations at the identified facilities.
- (6) Licensee must avoid pointing the transmitting antenna within 15 degrees of any point on the geostationary orbit arc while transmitting signals in the 14402.5-14537.5 MHz band
