This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. - (3) Operation is NOT PERMITTED using the following frequencies: 108.6 MHz, 109.1 MHz, 109.3 MHz, 116.8 MHz and 117.2 MHz.
- (4) The following frequencies have been identified as unavailable due to safety of flight issues: 108.3 MHz, 108.5 MHz, 109.6 MHz, 109.9 MHz, 113.4 MHz and 117.5 MHz.
