This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Special Conditions:

- (1) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (2) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (3) Boeing must get consents from the Advanced Wireless Service, the Educational Broadband Service and Broadband Radio Service licensees.
- (4) Boeing must coordinate with the local Society of Broadcast Engineer frequency coordinator and the Fixed Microwave Service licensees.
- (5) Stop Buzzers Jim Baranosky, 480-891-3263 and/or Andreina Panetta, 480-891-5494 must be available at all times during transmissions to mitigate any harmful interference to Navy assignment between the bands 1820 - 1840 MHz and 2200 - 2220 MHz.
- (6) Licensee ensure that all operations are perform inside the hangar as disclosed by the application request and ensure all doors and windows are close in order to minimize any potential interference to licensed station operating on these same frequencies.
