This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the authorization nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This authorization is subject to the right of use of control the Government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act of 1934.

Special Conditions:

- (1) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (2) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (3) The Boeing Company must coordinate with the Fixed Microwave Service licensees in adjacent band, 21.2-22.5 GHz and 31-31.3 GHz bands in accordance with 47 CFR, Part 101.103(d) prior to commencing the experimental operations.
- (4) Experimental station shall use the minimum power level necessary to establish communications links to minimize potential interference to licensed users.
- (5) The authorized station must be in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements as set forth in Section 17.4 of the Commission's Rules.
- (6) The authorized station must be in compliance with environmental requirement set forth in Section 1.1307 of the Commission's Rules.
- (7) This authorization is without prejudice to any determination that the Commission may make regarding pending or future experimental satellite earth station applications.
- (8) Operations are on a non-interference basis (NIB) and shall not cause harmful interference to, and shall not claim protection from, interference caused to it by any other lawfully operating station and it shall cease transmission(s) immediately upon notice of such interference and notify the FCC in writing.
- (9) All Boeing testing granted shall be conducted IAW the configuration and RF parameters that Boeing coordinated with Air Force (Jimmy Nguyen) and ARSTRAT (Travis Inghram) for this specific STA.
- (10) Any testing under this authorization is for purpose of supporting Boeing IRAD effort only.
- (11) The emissions designators listed in this grant are approved for the stated occupied bandwidth only. Occupied bandwidths that are less than the above emissions are not authorized.
- (12) As soon as possible but no later than 3 business days prior to any planned testing, Boeing is required to provide Jimmy Nguyen (Email: jimmy.nguyen@us.af.mil, AFSMO) and Travis J. Inghram (Email: travis.j.ingram.civ@mail.mil, ARSTRAT) with the planned testing date/duration and the stop buzzer POC for the testing. If planned testing conflicts with DoD operations, additional evaluations and/or restrictions will be required.
