Your assessment appears to be correct. We have collected a total of \$120 for those five STAs. However, for some reason, the system says you overpaid for 0057-EX-ST-2007 by \$60, while the other four show no payments. I'm not even sure how it is possible for the system to overcharge for an application, unless you paid for it once and then went back again. It should not be possible to overpay on a single attempt. My suggestion would be to pay for three of the unpaid applications and submit an exhibit to the fourth asking that the overpayment for 0057-EX-ST-2007 be applied to it.

I will also try to find out why you are getting the security notices.
