This will be the third time I have explained to you about requesting the whole band: 1400-2700 MHz. It would be better if you select spot (discrete) frequencies or a few frequency bands in the 1400-2700 MHz band that you have requested. Please submit the following information needed to process the experimental licensing application shown below:

- The following frequency bands are not allowed for operation:

1400-1427 MHz,
1427-1429.5 MHz,
1755-1850 MHz, and
2690-2700 MHz.

- Please prior coordinate the frequency bands 1435-1525 MHz, 2310-2320 MHz and 2345-2390 MHz with the Aerospace and Flight Test Radio Coordinating Council, (AFTRCC).

- Please provide the description of the operation to be conducted and its purpose in more details.

- Please explain why you are requesting for the entire "Educational Broadband Service (EBS) / Broadband Radio Service (BRS)" frequency band, 2496-2690 MHz? Can you select a few channels within the intended band? If yes, please amend your application.

- Please report the name and cell phone number of the Stop Buzzer, a person who can immediately cease transmissions at any time.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of March 24, 2010 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.
