This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the authorization nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This authorization is subject to the right of use of control the Government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act of 1934.

Special Temporary Authority is hereby granted to operate the apparatus described below:

The operation is to test the communications link for a nanosatellite.

Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (3) The authorized station must be in compliance with environmental requirement set forth in Section 1.1307 of the Commission's Rules.

- (5) Operations are on a non-interference basis (NIB) and shall not cause harmful interference to, and shall not claim protection from, interference caused to it by any other lawfully operating station and it shall cease transmission(s) immediately upon notice of such interference and notify the FCC in writing.
- (6) For operations in the 137.875 MHz, University at Buffalo Nanosatellite Laboratory must obtain a written consent from Orbcomm or remove the bands.
- (7) In the band 401-402 MHz, University at Buffalo Nanosatellite Laboratory must choose a frequency below 402.6 MHz in order to protect ongoing operations.
- (8) All operations on 400.05 MHz or in the below 402.6 MHz frequency band shall be pre-coordinated with the NASA Johnson Space Center Spectrum Manager, Cathy Sham (catherine.c.sham@nasa.gov), and the Deputy Spectrum Manager, Alan Chu (alan.h.chu@nasa.gov), at least 15 days in advance of operation.
- (9) Experimental station shall use the minimum power level necessary to establish communications links to minimize potential interference to licensed users.
- (10) The authorized station must be in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements as set forth in Section 17.4 of the Commission's Rules.
- (11) This authorization is without prejudice to any determination that the Commission may make regarding pending or future experimental satellite earth station applications.
