Special Conditions:

- (3) Licensee must be made aware that the bands, 1695-1710 MHz, 1755 MHz-1780 MHz and 2155-2180 MHz, are in the AWS 3 band to be licensed in the Commission's current auction proceedings. This license authorization can potentially be impacted as a result of the proceedings and licensee is advised to use another band for long term operation.
- (4) ViaSat must obtain consent from the Advanced Wireless Services licensees prior to accessing to 1710-1755 MHz.
- (5) Any operation in the 1850-1990 and 2130-2200 MHz band must be coordinated with the existing and future users to avoid interference.
