With respect to FCC CFR Part 0.459, Vocera Communications offers the following:

- (1) Identification of the specific information for which confidential treatment is sought;

The company names and any other pertinent information (addresses, telephone numbers, Contact persons, etc,) that may be provided to the Commission during the course of the Experimental License / STA process of the Vocera customers who will be participating in the Beta test program.

- (2) Identification of the Commission proceeding in which the information was submitted or a description of the circumstances giving rise to the submission;

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- (3) Explanation of the degree to which the information is commercial or financial, or contains a trade secret or is privileged;

The names of the Vocera customers that are participating in the Beta program is considered privileged information to Vocera Communications

- (4) Explanation of the degree to which the information concerns a service that is subject to competition;

The names of the customers who Vocera has enlisted to participate in the Beta program would be valuable to potential competitors of Vocera Communications in that if the names were made public, those seeking to compete with Vocera Communications could approach the customer and offer similar equipment or attempt to evaluate the performance of the new devices themselves from just outside the campus.

- (5) Explanation of how disclosure of the information could result in substantial competitive harm;

If the location of the beta test sites were to become public knowledge, it is possible that a competitor of Vocera Communications might attempt to interfere with the beta testing possible disrupt sales efforts of the new products.

- (6) Identification of any measures taken by the submitting party to prevent unauthorized disclosure;

The names of all of the Beta testers were not disclosed to the the Beta testers themselves. Vocera Communications employees have been told to treat the names of the Beta test sites as confidential.

All consultants working on the project for Vocera Communications have signed Non Disclosure agreements

(7) Identification of whether the information is available to the public and the extent of any previous disclosure of the information to third parties;

The names of the Beta testers have not been disclosed to the public.

(8) Justification of the period during which the submitting party asserts that material should not be available for public disclosure; and

The evaluation of the second generation of communications badges will be taking place for a minimum of 30 to 60 days, however it is possible that the Beta trial may be extended if the test results warrant such an extension. Therefore it is possible that Beta testing may continue for the duration of this STA. Thus, the names of the Beta testers should be held confidential for the duration of this STA.

(9) Any other information that the party seeking confidential treatment believes may be useful in assessing whether its request for confidentiality should be granted.
