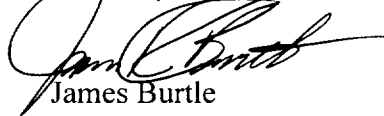
Dear Mr. Druhan:

This letter is to notify you that, pursuant to Section 5.83 of the Commission rules, your experimental license WB2XDK, file number 0008-EX-PL-1999, is hereby canceled. You must cease operation immediately. Failure to cease operation may result in further Commission action.

The Commission received a complaint from the Purcellville Police Department that you are not operating in adherence to your stated program of research as required by Section 5.113 of the Commission rules. In your application, you stated that data monitoring would be "conducted in a manner that will be transparent (to minimize the influence of artificial speed compliance behavior) to motorists in order to insure the speed data collected reflects actual speed behavior." The police department has raised concerns that your efforts have transformed from a transparent experimental mode into an overt law enforcement mode. Such actions have raised serious concerns with the police department for the public safety and are clearly not in the public interest or scope of your experiment to provide data to the Virginia Department of Transportation.

Accordingly, given that your operations are of serious concern to Virginia authorities and are not in the public interest, your authorization is canceled, effective as of November 18, 1999. Please return your license to the Commission in the envelope provided.
