Dear Mr. Burtle:

As you are aware, **AT&T** and Verizon have objected to WSI's Experimental License Application 0051-EX-PL-2008. Each has objected based upon a fear of possible interference resulting from WSI's proposed experiments. While WSI believes that those fears are unfounded, WSI is willing to accept a condition on the experimental license requiring WSI to inform each of Verizon and **AT&T** of the location of each DRE prior to its operation. In addition, WSI is willing to provide each with the coordination study of the DRE showing the coordinator's opinion that the DRE could have no impact on Verizon and **AT&T** and the coordinator's opinion that no response is required. This study would be provided at the same time as WSI provides notice of the intended operation of the DRE.

By engaging in that process, WSI will be doing everything that could possibly be required of it under Rule **101.103(d)**. As stated in WSI's Experimental License Application 0051-EX-PL-2008, the experiments will use stations licensed by regular authorization to WSI, and, hence, already successfully coordinated. Under Rule **101.103(d)(2)(ix)**, a subsequent change to a successful coordination does not require notice and response – but just notice – if the subsequent change from a successful coordination is determined not to have an impact on parties previously receiving the coordination, the parties are notified of the change and of the coordinator's opinion that no response is required.

Accordingly, as imposing such conditions on **WSI's** experimental license would require WSI to do everything it possibly would have to do under Rule **101.103(d)(2)(ix)**, we would hope that such license conditions would go far enough to allay fears of interference and to allow this useful experimentation of spectrum saving technology to begin without further delay.
