Request for Special Temporary Authority
Wireless Video, Inc.
Description of Situation Mandating Special Temporary Authority
pursuant to Section 1.931 of the Rules

Wireless Video, Inc. is a video production company which produces video from sporting events and other newsworthy events, under contract to television networks, cable networks, individual broadcasters, and film and video production entities. Wireless Video, Inc. (WVI) is also a research and development company which develops new electronic products for the video production industry.

WVI has developed a helmet camera video transmitter which is in the development and conceptual stage. It would be incorporated in helmets used by participants in sporting events, and would be used in transmission of on-field events, such as football games, to a receiver off the field. It is to be tested in field tests beginning November 10, 2000 at indoor and outdoor arenas in South Bend, Indiana at the campus of Notre Dame University. WVI requires special temporary authority for the use of four of these devices at that location for testing. It is impossible to obtain licensed use of this device, which is in the developmental stage, as the device has not been equipment authorized as yet, and cannot be licensed yet in the band in which it has been designed to operate presently. The intention of the applicant is to develop the concept and either authorize the device by rulemaking, or by configuration to meet Part 90 or Part 74 service rules.

The helmet camera transmitter will transmit video in 6 MHz bandwidths in the 10.3-10.7 GHz range. The antenna will be omnidirectional, with negative gain, and the power will be 60 mW ERP. They will be operated only within athletic stadiums, indoor and outdoor, and only on the campus of the University. No marketing will take place, but only technical tests by WVI technical personnel on site.
