#### 1.3 MPE Calculation Method

 $S = (30*P*G) / (377*R^2)$ 

S = power density (in appropriate units, e.g., mw/cm<sup>2</sup>)

P = power input to the antenna (in appropriate units, e.g., mw)

G = power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator, the power gain factor is normally numeric gain.

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna (in appropriate units, e.g., cm)

## **1.4 MPE Calculation Result**

Maximum peak output power: <u>17.46 (dBm)</u>
Maximum tune-up peak output power: <u>18 (dBm)</u>

Prediction distance: >20(cm)

The worst case is power density at prediction frequency at 20cm: <u>0.01(mw/cm²)</u> MPE limit for general population exposure at prediction frequency: <u>1 (mw/cm²)</u>
