

Schematic


Please refer to the schematic below to find the icons which on the front or back side of ty box, and insert the cable to the corresponding interface.

Installation Steps

- 01 Connect the TV Box with the power supply.
- O2 Connect the TV Box to your TV with an HD cable or AV cable.
- For a wired connection, plug in Ethernet cable from the TV Box to your modem or router. For wireless, choose your WiFi network and input the password.
