# ■ AC power connection

After checking all the connections have been made correctly, plug the AC power cord of this unit into the AC outlet.

#### Notes:

- Remove all batteries when using AC power.
- Unplug the AC power cord from the AC outlet if the unit will not be in use for a prolonged period of time.

# **■ DC** power connection

Recommended plug type

1/8"(3.5mm) IOI 7/32"(5.5mm)

#### Caution:

- During battery/DC operation, the unit will be set to Demonstration mode off with display and subwoofer light in MODE 2 to reduce the battery power consumption.
- When using battery/DC power, the remote control cannot be used to turn on the unit.
- Unplug the AC power cord from the unit before using the DC power. Otherwise the unit will not work.
- When the unit is not in use for an extended period, remove the DC cord from the DC IN 12 V jack.


# Operation with batteries

Fully charge an external device with AC power before using GX-BT9 battery operation.

- 1 Disconnect the AC and DC power cord, and remove the battery compartment cover.
- Remove all connection before installing batteries to avoid possible damage.
- Connection of the AC or DC power cord to the unit disconnects the batteries.



- 2 Insert 10 "D" size batteries (UM/SUM-1, R20, HP-2 or similar) into the battery compartment according to the sequence indicated on the rear panel.
- When inserting or removing the batteries (5) and (10), push them toward the (-) battery terminals.
- Installing the batteries incorrectly may cause the unit to malfunction.
- Batteries are not included.



# 3 Replace the battery compartment cover.

### Precautions for battery use:

- Insert the batteries according to the direction indicated on the rear panel.
- Remove the batteries if they are weak or if the unit will not be used for long periods of time. This will prevent potential damage due to battery leakage.
- Replace all old batteries with new ones at the same time.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.

### Battery replacement:

- When batteries are low, battery indicator "—" will blink to show that the batteries need to be replaced, sound may become distorted and unit may automatically turn off or mute during high volume level. Reduce the volume level or replace the batteries.
- When replacing the batteries, place the unit on a cushion or soft cloth to avoid damage.

# Cautions:

- Do not use rechargeable battery (nickel-cadmium battery, etc.).
- Immediately remove the discharged batteries. If the chemical leak into the unit, clean it.
- Batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

### ■ Bluetooth standby mode

The first time the unit is plugged in with AC power, the unit will enter the *Bluetooth* standby MODE 1.

Press the DEMO/[ECO]/**■** button on the main unit or DEMO/ECO button on the remote control to change the mode.

# ■ Battery installation

1 Open the battery cover.

2 Insert the supplied battery according to the terminal indicated in the battery compartment.

When inserting or removing the battery, push it toward the (–) battery terminals.

3 Close the cover.



- Installing the battery incorrectly may cause the unit to malfunction.
- Batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

### Notes concerning use:

- Replace the battery if the operating distance is reduced or if the operation becomes erratic. Purchase 2 "AAA" size battery. (UM/SUM4, R3, HP-16 or similar)
- Periodically clean the transmitter on the remote control and the sensor on the unit with a soft cloth.
- Exposing the sensor on the unit to strong light may interfere with operation. Change the lighting or the direction of the unit if this occurs.
- Keep the remote control away from moisture, heat, shock, and vibrations.

### Test of the remote control

Check the remote control after checking all the connections. Point the remote control directly at the remote sensor on the unit. The remote control can be used within the range shown below:



### Note:

Exposing the infrared remote control to direct sunlight may cause the remote control to be inoperable.


# Carrying the unit

#### Caution:

# ■ Using the carrying strap

This unit can be carried by using a supplied carrying strap. Insert the carrying strap carabiner (hook) to each end of the unit as shown below.



### Cautions:

- Before carrying the unit, make sure the carabiner (hook) is properly secured and closed, otherwise it will cause damage and injury.
- Carry this unit with FM antenna close to you and the display facing outward to avoid scratches on the display.





# ■ Display and Subwoofer light up control

The display and subwoofer light can be changed. Press the DIMMER button on the remote control to change the mode.

→MODE 1 (Display backlight on and Subwoofer light off)

MODE 2 (Display backlight off and Subwoofer light off)

MODE Off (Display backlight on and Subwoofer light on)

Notes:

- During battery/DC operation, the unit will be set to MODE 2 to reduce the battery power consumption.
- During MODE 2, press any button to light up the display backlight for a few seconds.

### ■ Volume auto fade-in

If you turn off and on the main unit with the volume set to 16 or higher, the volume starts at 15 and fades in to the last set level.

# ■ Volume control

Press VOLUME +/- buttons (on main unit) or VOL +/- (on remote control) to increase or decrease the volume.

### Direct key power on function

When you press any of the following buttons, the unit turns on

- BLUETOOTH ►/II or USB ►/II on the main unit or the remote control: selected function is activated.
- TUNER/AUDIO IN on the main unit: last tuner or audio function is activated.
- TUNER or AUDIO IN on the remote control: the unit turns on with the selected function activated.



## ■ Auto power off function

The main unit will enter the standby mode (when iPod, iPhone, guitar or microphone is not connected) after 15 minutes of inactivity during:

Audio In: No detection of input signal. USB: In the stop mode or no media.

Bluetooth: In the pause or stop mode and no incoming

signal from a source device.

# ■ Auto resume function

The auto resume function will resume the last functionshould there be a power failure or the AC power cord becomes disconnected. However, program and random mode are not memorized.

# ■ Equalizer

When the EQ button is pressed, the current mode setting will be displayed. To change to a different mode, press the EQ button repeatedly until the desired sound mode appears.

FLAT No equalization.

ROCK For rock music.

VOCAL Vocals are enhanced.

HIP HOP For hip hop music.

SALSA For salsa music.

REGGAE For reggae music.

# ■ Muting

The volume is muted temporarily when pressing the K button on the remote control. Press again to restore the volume.

### ■ X-Bass control

When the power is first turned on, the unit will enter the extra bass mode which emphasises the bass frequencies, and "X-BASS" will appear. To cancel the extra bass mode, press the X-BASS button. The last equaliser mode will turn on.

To turn on the X-Bass mode again, press the X-BASS button.

# ■ About NFC technology

Near Field Communication (NFC) is a set of standards for devices (smartphones/tablets) to establish radio communication with each other by touching/tapping them together or bringing them into close proximity.

Using NFC in this product simplifies the pairing method of *Bluetooth* connectivity.

### Notes for Android Device.


- This audio system supports NFC-enabled device with Android 4.1. Jelly Bean and higher.
- For device with a lower Android version, refer the operation manual of the device for recommended app (application).

Unlike other wireless technology, NFC requires no discovery or pairing.

Simply tap the source device to the NFC detection area to instantly enjoy seamless connectivity between your smart device and the audio system.

# ■ NFC detection area

NFC detection area location may vary depending on the device (smartphone/tablet). Refer operation manual of the device for detail.



# ■ NFC connection for audio playback

#### Check that:

- Your device (smartphone/tablet) has an NFC function.
- NFC function on your device is enabled.
- Screen lock function of the device is off.
- This unit is not in low power consumption (ECO) mode.

# Notes when using unit with a mobile phone

- This unit cannot be used to talk over the telephone even when there is a *Bluetooth* connection made to a mobile phone.
- Please refer to the operating manual supplied with the mobile phone for details on operation of your mobile phone while transmitting the sound using a *Bluetooth* connection.





# ■ Pairing Bluetooth devices

Bluetooth devices need to be initially paired first before they can exchange data. Once paired, it is not necessary to pair them again unless:

- pairing is made with more than 99 devices.

# **■** Tuning

- 1 Press the ON/STANDBY button to turn the power on.
- 2 Press the TUNER button on the remote control or TUNER/ AUDIO IN button on the main unit repeatedly to select FM Stereo or FM Mono.
- 3 Press the TUNING (v or ^) button on the remote control to tune in to the desired station.
  - Manual tuning:
    - Press the TUNING (v or A) button repeatedly to tune in to the desired station.
  - Auto tuning:
    - When the TUNING ( $\checkmark$  or  $\land$ ) button is pressed for more than 0.5 seconds, scanning will start automatically and the tuner will stop at the first receivable broadcast station.

#### Notes:

- When radio interference occurs, auto scan tuning may stop automatically at that point.
- Auto scan tuning will skip weak signal stations.
- To stop the auto tuning, press the TUNING (✓ or ∧) button again.



# ■ Connecting a guitar / microphone

#### Caution:


Be careful not to connect a bass guitar as it might damage this unit.



- 1 Set the guitar/microphone volume (GAIN) knob to the minimum level
- 2 Connect a guitar/microphone to the correct input jack.
  - Use a microphone with a 6.3 mm (1/4") diameter plug.
  - Use a standard plug adaptor when using a microphone with a 3.5 mm (1/8") diameter plug.
- 3 Arrange the guitar/microphone cables into the grooves of the cable holder on the left or the right side of the unit.

Then, thread the cable through the bottom of the unit.

Do not let the cables to be on top of the unit when using guitar/microphone as it may cause the unit to roll over causing damage and injury.



4 Connect the cables to a guitar/microphone.

### 5 Select a source.

- To mix a guitar or microphone sound with a source sound, select the playback source (Bluetooth/USB/Audio In/Tuner).
- To play a guitar or using the microphone only, select 'AUDIO IN' function. Make sure there is no playback from Audio In connection.
- 6 Adjust the volume (GAIN) knob on the connected equipment.
- To enjoy a guitar distortion effect, turn the guitar volume (GAIN) knob to almost maximum level.

#### Caution:

- When not using the guitar/microphone, remove it from the jack.
- Before disconnecting the guitar/microphone, set the guitar/ microphone volume (GAIN) knob to the minimum level.

# **■** Echo control (Karaoke)

Toggle the echo level with ECHO ✓ or ECHO ✓ button.

### Notes:

- The sound is produced in 2-channel stereo automatically while playing karaoke.
- When you sing too loud through the microphone, your voice may be distorted depending on the devices connected. If this happens, lower the microphone volume
- If an extremely sensitive microphone is used, howling may be generated.
- Unidirectional microphone is more appropriate for vocal use.
- When you connect or disconnect a microphone, the sound is muted for few seconds.
- Karaoke is not supported at Tuner function.

# If squealing occurs:

- Reduce the microphone volume.
- Change the direction of the microphone.
- Reduce the volume of the main unit.
- Move the microphone away from the speakers.



### Notes on sound multiplexed:

- Sound multiplexed sources are sources on which the main vocal and the BGM (Background music) have been recorded on one of the two channels and only the BGM on the other.
- The function will not work properly with sources which do not belong to this group.
- Music on which vocal has been recorded on the left channel and music on the right may not play properly.

# Connecting other equipment (continued)

Listening to the playback sounds of portable audio player, etc.



- 1 Use a connection cord to connect the portable audio player etc. to the AUDIO IN jack. When using video equipment, connect the audio output to this unit and the video output to a television.
- 2 Press the ON/STANDBY button to turn the power on.
- 3 Press the AUDIO IN button on the remote control or TUNER/ AUDIO IN button repeatedly on the main unit to select AUDIO IN function.
- 4 Play the connected equipment. If volume level of the connected device is too high, sound distortion may occur. Should this happen, lower the volume of the connected device. If volume level is too low, increase the volume of the connected device.

#### Note

To prevent noise interference, place the unit away from the television

### Headphones

- Do not turn the volume on to full at switch on and listen to music at moderate levels. Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.
- Before plugging in or unplugging the headphone, reduce the volume.
- Be sure your headphone has a 3.5 mm (1/8") diameter plug and impedance between 16 and 50 ohms. The recommended impedance is 32 ohms.
- Plugging in the headphone disconnects the speakers automatically. Adjust the volume using the VOLUME control.

# Troubleshooting chart

Many potential problems can be resolved by the owner without calling a service technician.

If something is wrong with this product, check the following before calling your authorised SHARP dealer or service center.

# ■ General

Symptom	Possible cause
When a button is pressed, the unit does not respond.	Set the unit to the power standby mode and then turn it back on. If the unit still malfunctions, reset it. (Refer "Factory reset, clearing all memory".)
No sound is heard.	<ul><li>The volume level is set to "MIN".</li><li>The headphones are connected.</li></ul>
<ul><li>Sound too low or distorted.</li><li>Power suddenly shuts down.</li></ul>	The batteries are depleted. Change the batteries.

### ■ Remote control

Symptom	Possible cause
The remote control does not operate.	The AC power cord of the unit is not plugged in. Wrong battery polarity. The batteries are exhausted. The distance or angle is incorrect. The remote control sensor receives strong light or sunlight.

# ■ NFC / Bluetooth

Symptom	Possible cause
No sound is heard.	<ul> <li>The unit is too far from the Bluetooth stereo audio source device.</li> <li>The unit is not paired with the Bluetooth stereo audio source device.</li> </ul>
Bluetooth sound is interrupted or distorted.	<ul> <li>The unit is too near to a device that generates electromagnetic radiation.</li> <li>There is an obstacle between the unit and the Bluetooth stereo audio source device.</li> </ul>
NFC-enabled device cannot connect to Bluetooth via NFC tag.	Main unit is not in Bluetooth pairing mode. Perform "NFC connection for audio playback". (Refer page 11.)

# ■ Condensation

Sudden temperature changes, storage or operation in an extremely humid environment may cause condensation inside the cabinet or on the transmitter on the remote control. Condensation can cause the unit to malfunction. If this happens, leave the power on until normal playback is possible (about 1 hour). Wipe off any condensation on the transmitter with a soft cloth before operating the unit.

# ■ If problem occurs

When this product is subjected to strong external interference (mechanical shock, excessive static electricity, abnormal supply voltage due to lightning, etc.) or if it is operated incorrectly, it may malfunction.

### If such a problem occurs, do the following:

- 1 Set the unit to the standby mode and turn the power on again.
- 2 If the unit is not restored in the previous operation, unplug and plug in the unit again, and then turn the power on.

#### Note:

If neither operation above restores the unit, clear all the memory by resetting it.

# ■ Factory reset, clearing all memory

- 1 Press the ON/STANDBY button to turn the power on.
- 2 Press the AUDIO IN button on the remote control or TUNER/AUDIO IN button on the main unit repeteadly to select AUDIO IN function.
- 3 Press ◄ button on the main unit once.
- 4 Press and hold USB ►/II button on the main unit until reset appears.



### Caution:

This operation will erase all data stored in memory including tuner preset.

# ■ Cleaning the cabinet

Periodically wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth and a diluted soap solution, then with a dry cloth.

# Caution:

- Do not use chemicals for cleaning (gasoline, paint thinner, etc.).
   It may damage the cabinet.
- Do not apply oil to the inside of the unit. It may cause malfunctions.
