
Metal Bluetooth Speaker and Wireless Charging Pad

Instructions:

- (Be sure to fully charge the speaker before using for the first time).
- 1. Charging the Speaker
- . Connect the provided charging cable to a power source and to the micro USB port on the speaker (6).

The LED indicator light will glow red when charging and turn off when fully charged.

2. Wireless Charging:

- · Connect speaker to a 2A output with the provided cable. Wireless Charging LED(4) will glow red once connected.
- · Place wireless charging supported mobile device on top charging pad, LED will glow green when device is charging.
- Phone will begin to charge automatically. 3. Bluetooth® Setup:
- . Press and hold Power Button(1) to turn ON the speaker. Bluetooth LED Indicator(2) will flash BLUE
- . Turn on the Bluetooth function on mobile device. Select "Metal Wireless" pairing name. LED will turn solid BLUE if successfully paired.
- . Speaker will automatically pair if the mobile device has been paired before.
- . Press and hold Power Button(1) to turn off
- the device

4. Playing Music:

- · Short press "Play/Pause" key to pause music. A second short press will resume playing music again.
- "Vol+/Next track":
- Short press next track. Long press - increase volume. "Vol-/Previous track".
- Short press previous track Long press - reduce volume
