### Statement

Thank you for purchasing our product model SP6040,UW6006K,SP6040-9021, a high performance Smartphone. This Smartphone is based on the Android operative system 4.4.

The product is designed with several functions, including WCDMA, WIFI, BT, GPS, FM, voice calls and many more. You can easily storage wireless and Internet communications, you can surf the Internet when and where you wish; the equipment has a GPS module, so you can surf through software already installed (or to be installed). The device has multiple sensors, providing it a total innovative functioning.

The current manual will provide you with the basic technical functions. Before first use, please, read it fully and carefully.

### 1.2 Advice

#### Maintenance

- The Smartphone must be always dry. In order to avoid damage in the device, malfunctioning due to corrosion or short-circuit, avoid the following elements being exposed to water: the device, battery and charger. Under no circumstance manipulate the device or charger with wet hands.

## INTRODUCTION TO SMARTPHONE

### 2.1 SMARTPHONE preparation and functioning

#### Charging the battery

- Before using this Smartphone, please use the adaptor included to get the total charge of the battery.

### 2.2 Smartphone condition and alerts

When appearing an alert pop up, slide the screen downwards, so the list of alerts can be displayed. To close the alert screen, slide upwards. Refer to the state icons below:

## Quick Start Guide

### 3.1 Keyboard Functions

Description of the keyboard functions:

On/off key	For stand by function, press the key quickly and for turning off, press the key for a few seconds.
Volume + (up)	Turn up the volume
Volume - (down)	Turn down the volume
Home key 	Regardless the interface you are at, this selection will bring you to the main one.
Back key 	Regardless the interface you are at, this selection will bring you to the previous one.
Menu key 	It shows up the menu interface
Record key 	It shows the record of recent navigation

### T-flash Card (Micro SD) and SIM Card

- The Smartphone has a T-flash (Micro SD) port. The T-Flash port (Micro SD) is a method to increase the storage memory of the Smartphone. This card is a small one, the installation or extraction requires care and attention to avoid damage.
- The Smartphone has a double SIM port. Insert the SIM card1 in the card port 1; insert the Micro SIM card2 in the port for the card 2. The SIM cards and contacts can be easily damaged, so please be careful when inserting or extracting the SIM cards.

### 3.2 Starting and turning off

#### Starting

Press the POWER key for three seconds; you will see the starting image. The system starts the blocking state that you will have to unblock.

#### Shutting down

1. Press POWER key for a few seconds and you will see the shutting down window.
2. The shutting down selection window has four options: mute, airplane mode, restart and shutting down.
3. Select the option you wish.

### 3.3 How to open and close screens.

1. In order to save battery, the screens will close automatically when inactive.
2. To close immediately an open window, press the Record key and move it either to the right or to the left.

#### To unlock the home screen

In order to unlock the home screen, press quickly the POWER key. The screen will be blocked and will show an image as the one below. To unlock, slide it to the right and the icon (open lock) will appear unblocking the screen.



#### 3.4 Use of touch screen

##### Methods of use

The methods below are used to see and use the touch screen, menu and applications of your Smartphone.

##### Selection (Click)

Whenever you want to use the screen keyboard or select an application through the main interface, you can do it selecting it with your finger.

##### Movements

In order to move through the screen, use the applications or navigate in your Smartphone interfaces, you can do it with finger movements, both vertical and horizontal.

##### Rotate

In order to rotate the interface in the screen, you only need to rotate the Smartphone to one side so it changes the orientation from vertical to horizontal and vice versa. You can do this while writing texts, watching videos, movies or images.

### 3.5 Application screen

In order to see the application screen (as shown in image 3.2), press  , you will see a window allowing you to access the installed applications, file folders, widgets, information (alerts) etc.



























The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

#### Body-worn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations. To comply with RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 10mm must be maintained between the user's body and the handset, including the antenna. Third-party belt-clips, holsters, and similar accessories used by this device should not contain any metallic components. Body-worn accessories that do not meet these requirements may not comply with RF exposure requirements and should be avoided. Use only the supplied or an approved antenna.
