

#### **Precautions before use**

- Avoid obstruction of the air inlet and outlet.
- The power indicator on the bottom of the all-in-one will remain lit after the power is turned on.
- The system will start up when it is used for the first time. Do not force power off to avoid data loss or damage to the system.




#### Equipment start-up

Warning: When connecting the keyboard and mouse to the all in one, make sure that the computer and other equipment are in the off state, do not switch them on.




Connect the keyboard and mouse as shown in the picture to the specified keyboard and mouse interface of the all in one.



Connect the all in one to the power outlet

Plug the power cord into the equipment plug and the other end into a 100~240V AC outlet and press the power button.





Precautions

Please follow the following safety precautions when using your device.

Do not use power cords, damaged plugs or loose plugs. Do not bend or damage the power cord. Do not touch the power cord with wet hands or pull the cord to disconnect the charger.

Do not use the device while it is charging or touch it with wet hands.

Do not hit or drop the charger and do not charge the battery with chargers that are not approved by the manufacturer.

Do not use your device during an electrical storm. Handle and discard batteries and chargers with care.

Do not handle damaged lithium ion batteries or that show leakage.

Do not use the device near a pacemaker. If possible, avoid using it at a distance inferior to 15 cm, because the device can interfere with the pacemaker.

Do not use the device in a hospital or near medical equipment that can be interfered by radio frequency.

If you use medical equipment always make sure they are protected against radio frequencies. If you use a hearing aid, let the manufacturer know to obtain further information about interference.

If you want to charge the device, you must install an easily accessible power outlet.




## 7. Install the 2.5" disk


Before install the 2.5" disk, the device must power off. follow the steps as below to install the 2.5" disk.



a. The disk is facing up, with the R bracket at the bottom and the L Bracket at the top.

b. Fix the R bracket and L bracket to the lower part of the disk with four CM3 \* 4 screws, note that the bend faces up when fixed.






c. Insert the mounted disk into the interface.

d. Use two PA2.5 \* 5 screws to secure the hard disk holder to the rear housing.

If the disk is used for the first time, you need to follow the steps as below. a. Right click the Start menu and select "Disk Management"



b. The window of Initialize Disk will appear automatically. Click OK and the disk will be initialized.





