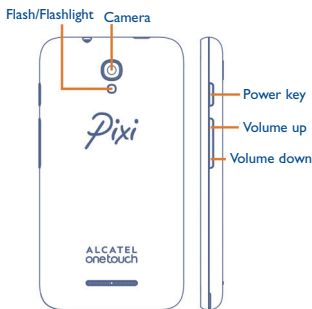

Menu key

- **Option menu.** Touch to access **WALLPAPERS, WIDGETS and SETTINGS.**
- **Recent apps.** Touch to open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently. Touch it to open an app. Swipe it left to remove a thumbnail from the list. Swipe it to the right to lock it.

Home key

- From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.
- Long press to open Google search.

Back key

- Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from **Power off/Restart/Airplane mode** or **Ringer mode** icons.
- Press to mute the ringtone when there's an incoming call.
- Press and hold **Power** key and **Volume down** key to capture a screenshot.

Volume keys

- In call mode, adjust the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.

1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Set up

Removing or installing the back cover



Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.

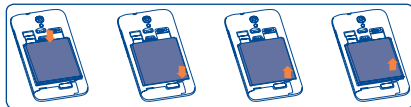


For dual SIM models, both SIM1 and SIM2 can support 2G and 3G networks. If both of them are 3G SIM cards, only one card can support 3G network ⁽¹⁾.

Installing or removing the battery

Power off your phone before removing the battery.



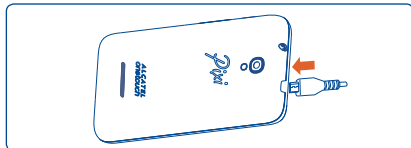
- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the cover.
- Unclick the cover, then remove the battery.

Installing or removing the microSD card



To install, place the external microSD card into the slot with the gold contact facing down. To remove the external microSD card, press and slide it out.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and plug it into the socket.



If the battery is very low, there will be no indication that power is being received until the charge is sufficient to show the charging status bar. To reduce power consumption and energy waste, once the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

Press and hold the **Power** key until the phone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you should set the following options: language, input method, Google Account, etc.

If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google Account to use some features.

For dual SIM mode, you should select a SIM card or choose **Always Prompt** for voice call, messaging, etc. ⁽¹⁾

1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the phone options appear; select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all of the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to Home screen.

Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the notification panel.



Search bar

- Touch ① to enter text search screen.
- Touch ② to enter voice search screen.

Favorite applications tray

- Touch to enter the application.
- Long press to move or change applications.

Application tab

- Touch to open main menu.

The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

Long press



Long press the item to enter the available options for setting the Home screens.

Drag



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen up and down to scroll through the applications, images, web pages, etc.

Flick



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

Pinch/Spread



Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Rotate



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better view.

1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can see both phone status (to the right side) and notification information (to the left side).

1.3.7 Volume adjustment

You can set ringer, media, and phone ringtone volume to your preference by pressing **Volume up/down** key or touching **Settings\Audio Profiles\General\ Edit\ Volume**.

1.4 Applications and widgets

The Applications (apps) list contains all pre-embedded and newly installed apps.

To access the list, touch  from the Home screen. To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

By touching and holding an empty area on the Home screen, you can switch to widget interface mode.

2 Text input

2.1 Using Onscreen Keyboard

Onscreen Keyboard settings

Touch the application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings\Language & input**, touch the Settings icon  on the right of **Android keyboard** or **TouchPal** and then a series of settings are available for your selection.

Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by marking the checkbox in **Settings\Display\ Auto-rotate screen**.

2.1.1 Android keyboard



Touch to enter text or numbers.

Touch to switch between "abc/Abc" mode; Touch and hold to switch between "abc/ABC" mode.

Touch to enter symbols/emoticons.

Long press to show input options; when Wi-Fi or data connection is on, touch to enter voice input.
Touch to switch between symbol and numeric keyboard.

2.1.2 TouchPal



Slide through letters to input characters

Touch to delete incorrect characters

Touch to insert a space or complete the current word or long press to switch voice input

Touch to enter **Numbers** and symbols, etc.

2.2 Text editing

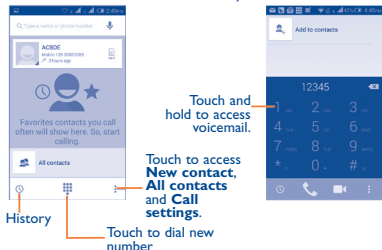
You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double-tap within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will appear: **Select all** , **Cut** , **Copy**  and **Paste** .
- Touch the icon  to confirm.

3 Phone call

3.1 Placing a call

To make a call when the phone is on, go to the Home screen and touch the Phone icon in the Favorites tray.



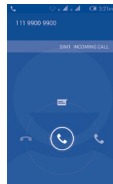
Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **All contacts** or **Call log** by sliding or touching tabs, then touch  to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching  and selecting **Add to Contacts**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up a call, touch .

3.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, touch .

- Slide right to answer;
- Slide left to reject;
- Slide up to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key or turn the phone over (when the **Settings\ Gestures\ Turn over to mute** option is activated).

3.3 Consulting your call memory

You can access your call memory by touching  from the Dial screen to see call history in categories of Incoming calls, Outgoing calls, and Missed calls.

3.4 Speed dial settings

You can access this setting screen by touching  and then **Speed Dial Settings** on Dial screen, then select contacts to define 2-9 screen keys as a speed dialler. Touch the contact and select **Delete fast dial** to remove it from speed dial.

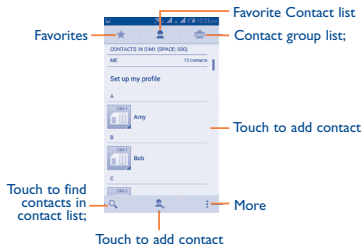
4 People



You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

4.1 Adding a contact

Touch the Application tab on the Home screen, select **People** app, then touch the icon in the contact list to create a new contact.



4.2 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From Contacts screen, touch to open the options menu, touch **Import/Export**, then choose to import/export contacts from/to SIM card, Phone, SD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), select the contact you want to import/export, and touch **Done** to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), touch **Select all** and touch **Done** to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch a contact you want to share, touch and **Share** from the contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

4.3 Synchronizing contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data, or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

5 Messaging.....



You can create, edit, and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

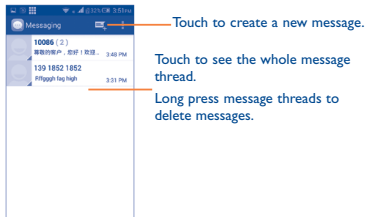
To open Messaging, go to the Home screen and touch the Messaging icon in the Favorites tray.



All messages you receive or send out can be saved in phone memory or SIM card. To check the SMS messages stored on your SIM card, touch from Messaging screen, then touch **Settings\SIM CARD SETTING \ Manage SIM Settings**.

5.1 Write message

On the message list screen, touch the new message icon to write text/multimedia messages.



Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient in the **To** bar or touch  to add recipients, touch **Type message** bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch  to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific (accented) letters will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, pictures, contacts, calendar, slides, and audio to other compatible phones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or Subject or email addresses are added.

6 Email

Other than your Gmail account, you can also set up external POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts in your phone.

To open Email, go to the Home screen and touch the Email icon in the Favorites tray.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- Touch **Next**. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Alternatively, you can touch **Manual setup** to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- To add another email account, you can touch  and **Settings**, and finally touch **ADD ACCOUNT** on the right of the title to create the account.

To create and send emails

- Touch the icon  on the **Inbox** screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the **To** field.
- If necessary, touch  and touch **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind carbon copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch , touch **Attach picture**, **Attach video**, or **Attach others** to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch  to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch  and **Save draft** or touch **Back** key to save a copy.

7 Getting connected.....

To connect to the Internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/3G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

7.1 Connecting to the Internet

7.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G

The first time you turn on your phone with a SIM card inserted it will automatically configure network service: GPRS, EDGE or 3G. If the network is not connected, you can touch  on the Quick settings bar.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then touch **Settings** | **More...** | **Mobile networks** | **Access Point Names** or **Network operators**.

7.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on the phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch  on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch the switch  next to Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi on/off.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, detailed information of all detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Select a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you will need to enter a password or other credentials (contact your network operator for details). When finished, touch **Connect**.

7.2 Browser.....

You can enjoy surfing the Web by using the Browser.

To get onto the Web, go to the Home screen and touch the Browser icon in the Favorites tray.

To go to a web page

On the Browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then touch  to confirm.

7.3 Connecting to a computer

You can transfer media files and other files between a micro SD card/ internal storage and a computer by using a USB cable.

Before using MTP or PTP, first select **USB debugging**.

- Touch **Settings\About phone**, tap **Build number** 7 times, then touch **Settings\Developer options\USB debugging**.

To connect/disconnect your phone to/from the computer:

- Use the USB cable to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- If you use mass storage, open the Notification panel and touch **USB connected**, then mark the checkbox of **USB storage** in the dialog that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.
- If you use MTP or PTP, your phone will be automatically connected.

To disconnect (from mass storage):

- Unmount the microSD card on your computer.
- Open the Notification panel and deselect **USB storage**.



For Windows XP or lower operating systems, you should download and install Windows Media Player 11 on your computer.

To locate the data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the applications list.
- Touch **File Explorer**.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Explorer**, where you can see media files (videos, photos, music, and others), rename files, install applications on your phone, etc.

7.4 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

To turn on USB tethering or Portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Touch  on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch **More...|Tethering & portable hotspot**.
- Mark the checkbox for **USB tethering** or turn on **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate this function.



These functions may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas. You can check data usage by touching **Settings\Data usage**.

8 Find my location using GPS satellites

To activate your phone's global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver:

- Touch  on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch **Location**.
- Touch the switch  next to **Location** to turn on.

Find your location by opening Maps:



Use your phone's GPS satellite receiver to pinpoint your location within an accuracy as close as several meters ("street level"). The process of accessing the GPS satellite and setting your phone's precise location for the first time will require up to 5 minutes. You will need to stand in a place with a clear view of the sky and avoid moving. After this, GPS will only need 20-40 seconds to identify your precise location. You can then start the navigation to find the target location.

9 Data backup

This phone enables you to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers, with your Google Account.

If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new phone the first time you sign in with your Google Account.

To activate this function:

- Touch  on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch **Backup & reset** | **Back up my data** to select the checkbox.

Once activated, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the Onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings configured within the Settings application. If you deactivated this option, settings are no longer backed up, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

10 Factory data reset

To activate factory data reset:

- Touch  on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch **Backup & reset** | **Factory data reset**
- Touch **Reset phone** | **Erase everything**

Phone reset will erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google Account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded. If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

Applications & Internal storage ...

11.1 Applications

With this phone, some built-in Google applications and other third party applications are available for your convenience.

With the built-in applications, you can:

- Communicate with friends.

- Exchange messages or emails with friends.
- Track your location, view traffic situations, search for locations and get navigation information to your destination.
- Download more applications from Google Play Store and more.

11.2 Internal storage

Touch **Settings** > **Storage** to display the amount of internal phone storage used by the operating system, its components, applications (including those you downloaded), permanent and temporary data.

All personal music, pictures, applications, and files will be saved in internal phone storage if no external SD card is inserted.



If a warning message comes up saying that phone memory is limited, you will need to free up space by deleting some unwanted applications, downloaded files, etc.

12 Making the most of your phone

You can download software upgrades for free from the website (www.alcatelonetouch.com).

12.1 Smart Suite

Smart Suite includes:

- **Contacts**
Allows you to back up contact entries so that you don't have to worry about losing, breaking, switching phones, or changing service providers.
- **Messages**
Frees you from painstakingly inputting text on the keypads. All of your messages are easily accessible and well organized.
- **Calendar**
Allows you to sync events freely between your phone and Outlook and create and edit new events from a PC.

- **Allows**
Allows you to easily import photos from a PC or the handset and organize them in different albums for better management.
- **Videos**
Allows you to insert video files from a PC for playback and then upload to a handset folder.
- **Music**
Allows you to quickly search for your favorite music on a PC, manage the ultimate Library, and enjoy the easiest digital jukebox in your own mobile way.
- **Application**
Allows you to import downloaded mobile applications and have them installed onto your handset upon synchronization.
- **Backup**
Allows you to back up your contacts, messages, calendar, photos and applications, then import the backup files to your phone.

12.2 Upgrade

You can use the Mobile Upgrade tool or FOTA Upgrade tool to update your phone's software.

12.2.1 Mobile Upgrade

Download Mobile Upgrade from the ALCATEL ONETOUCH website (www.alcatelonetouch.com) and install it on your PC. Launch the tool and update your phone by following the step by step instructions (see the User Guide provided together with the tool). Your phone's software will now have the latest software.



All personal information will be permanently lost following the update process. We recommend you back up your personal data using Smart Suite before upgrading.

12.2.2 FOTA Upgrade

Using the FOTA Upgrade tool you can update your phone's software.

To access **System Updates**, open the notification panel, touch  and then , then press **About phone\Wireless updates**. Or you can directly touch  and access **Settings\About phone**. Touch **Check for updates**, and the phone will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, touch the **Download** button, after it's done touch **Install** to complete the upgrade. Now your phone's software will have the latest version.

You should turn on data connection before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check intervals and reminders about upgrades are also available once you restart the phone.

If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, the  will appear in the status bar. Touch the notification to access the **System Updates** directly.



During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your mobile phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

• TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile phone when the vehicle is not parked. Over 55°C (131°F) the legibility of the mobile phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw, or try to bend your mobile phone.
