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2.3 Test Methodology

The radiated emission measurements were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.10:2009. Radiated emission measurement was performed in semi-anechoic chamber; all radiated tests were performed at an antenna to EUT distance of 3 meters, unless stated otherwise.

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3.0 System Test Configuration

3.1 Justification

For emissions testing, the equipment under test (EUT) setup to transmit continuously to simplify the measurement methodology. Care was taken to ensure proper power supply voltages during testing. During testing, the signal is maximized through rotation and placement in the three orthogonal axes. The antenna height and polarization are varied during the search for maximum signal level. The antenna height is varied from 1 to 4 meters. Radiated emissions are taken at three meters unless the signal level is too low for measurement at that distance. If necessary, a pre-amplifier is used and/or the test is conducted at a closer distance.

All readings are extrapolated back to the equivalent three meter reading using inverse scaling with distance. Analyzer resolution is 100 kHz or greater for frequencies below 1000 MHz. The resolution is 1 MHz or greater for frequencies above 1000 MHz. The spurious emissions more than 20 dB below the permissible value are not reported.

For an intentional radiator, the spectrum shall be investigated from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device, without going below 9 kHz, up to at least the frequency shown in the following table:



The antenna is an integral antenna and no consideration of replacement. The best case gain of the antenna is 0 dBi.

[Where F is the frequency in MHz, the formulas for calculating the maximum permitted fundamental field strengths are as follows: for the band 130-174 MHz, uV/m at 3 meters = 56.81818(F) - 6136.3636; for the band 260-470 MHz, uV/m at 3 meters = 41.6667(F) - 7083.3333. The maximum permitted unwanted emission level is 20 dB below the maximum permitted fundamental level.]

The fundamental frequency of the EUT is 315MHz

The limit for average field strength dBuV/m for the fundamental emission= 75.6 $dB\mu V/m$ No fundamental is allowed in the restricted bands.

Spurious Emissions do not fall in the restricted bands must be less than 55.6 dBuV/m or limits shown in Section 15.209, whichever limit permits a higher field strength.



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

1) 9 kHz to 30 MHz emissions:






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2) 30 MHz to 1 GHz emissions:

Test Procedure:

1) 9 kHz to 30 MHz emissions:

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For testing performed with the loop antenna. The centre of the loop was positioned 1 m above the ground and positioned with its plane vertical at the special distance from the EUT. During testing the loop was rotated about its vertical axis for maximum response at each azimuth and also investigated with the loop positioned in the horizontal plane.

2) 30 MHz to 1 GHz emissions:

For testing performed with the bi-log type antenna. The measurement is performed with the EUT rotated 360°, the antenna height scanned between 1m and 4m, and the antenna rotated to repeat the measurement for both the horizontal and vertical antenna polarizations.

3) 1 GHz to 40 GHz emissions:

Test site with RF absorbing material covering the ground plane that met the site validation criterion called out in CISPR 16-1-4:2007 was used to perform radiated emission test above 1 GHz.

For testing performed with the horn antenna. The measurement is performed with the EUT rotated 360°, the antenna height scanned between 1m and 4m, and the antenna rotated to repeat the measurement for both the horizontal and vertical antenna polarizations.

The average correction factor is computed by analyzing the on time in 100ms over one complete pulse train. Analysis of the remote transmitter on time in one complete pulse train, therefore the average value of fundamental frequency is: Average = Peak value + 20log (Duty cycle), where the duty factor is calculated from following formula:

The duration of one cycle =10.6ms

Effective period of the cycle =(0.63x4+0.14x5) ms=3.22 ms

DC =3.22/10.6=0.3038 or 30.38%

Therefore, the averaging factor is found by 20lg0.3038=-10.3



2) other emissions:

The receiver was scanned from the lowest frequency generated within the EUT to 3.5 GHz. The field strength is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor, Cable Factor & Peramplifier. The basic equation with a sample calculation is as follows:

Final Test Level = Receiver Reading + Antenna Factor + Cable Factor - Peramplifier Factor.

Remark:

According to 15.35 (b) When average radiated emission measurements are specified in the regulations, including emission measurements below 1000 MHz, there is also a limit on the radio frequency emissions, as measured using instrumentation with a peak detector function, corresponding to 20 dB above the maximum permitted average limit for the frequency being investigated unless a different peak emission limit is otherwise specified in the rules, e.g., see Section 15.255.



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4.3 Occupied Bandwidth

Test Requirement: FCC Part 15 C section 15.231 (c)

Test Method: ANSI C63.10: Clause 6.9

Test Status: Test in transmitting mode at lowest and highest channel.

Requirements: 15.231 (c) The bandwidth of the emission shall be no wider

than 0.25% of the center frequency for devices operating above 70 MHz and below 900 MHz. For devices operating above 900 MHz, the emission shall be no wider than 0.5% of the center frequency. Bandwidth is determined at the

points 20 dB down from the modulated carrier.

Method of measurement: The useful radiated emission from the EUT was detected by

the spectrum analyzer with peak detector. Record the 20 dB

bandwidth of the carrier.



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4.4 Dwell Time:

Test Requirement: FCC Part 15 C section 15.231(a)
Test Method: FCC Part 15 C section 15.231(a)

Test Status: Test in transmitting mode.

Requirements:

1. Regulation 15.231 (a) The provisions of this Section are restricted to periodic operation within the band 40.66 40.70 MHz and above 70 MHz. Except as shown in paragraph (e) of this Section, the intentional radiator is restricted to the transmission of a control signal such as those used with alarm systems, door openers, remote switches, etc. Radio control of toys is not permitted. Continuous transmissions, such as voice or video, and data transmissions are not permitted. The prohibition against data transmissions does not preclude the use of recognition codes. Those codes are used to identify the sensor that is activated or to identify the particular component as being part of the system.

Result:

The EUT is a remote switch without audio or video transmitted.

The EUT meets the requirements of this section.

2. Regulation 15.231 (a1) A manually operated transmitter shall employ a switch that will automatically deactivate the transmitter within not more than 5 seconds of being released.


