IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- **Read these instructions** – All the safety and operating instructions should be read before this product is operated.
- **Keep these instructions** – The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- **Heed all warnings** – All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- **Follow all instructions** – All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- **Do not use this apparatus near water** – The appliance should not be used near water or moisture – for example, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, and the like.

Electrical Safety

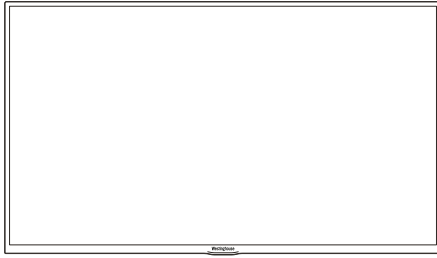
- The TV set should only be connected to a main power supply with voltage that matches the label at the rear of the product.
- To prevent overload, do not share the same power supply socket with too many other electronic components.
- Do not place any connecting wires where they may be stepped on or tripped over.
- Do not place heavy items on any connecting wire, which may damage the wire.
- Hold the main plug, not the wires, when removing from a socket.
- When not using the television for long periods, turn off the power.
- During a thunderstorm unplug the television.
- Do not allow water or moisture to enter the TV or power adapter. Do not use in wet, moist areas, such as bathrooms, steamy kitchens or near swimming pools.
- Pull the plug out immediately, and seek professional help if the main plug or cable is damaged, liquid is spilled onto the set, if the TV set is accidentally exposed to water or moisture, if anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots or if the TV set does not work normally. Do not remove the safety covers. There are no user serviceable parts inside. Trying to service the unit yourself is dangerous and may invalidate the product's warranty. Qualified personnel must only service this apparatus.
- To avoid a battery leak, remove batteries from the remote control when the remote is not in use for a long period, or when the batteries are exhausted.

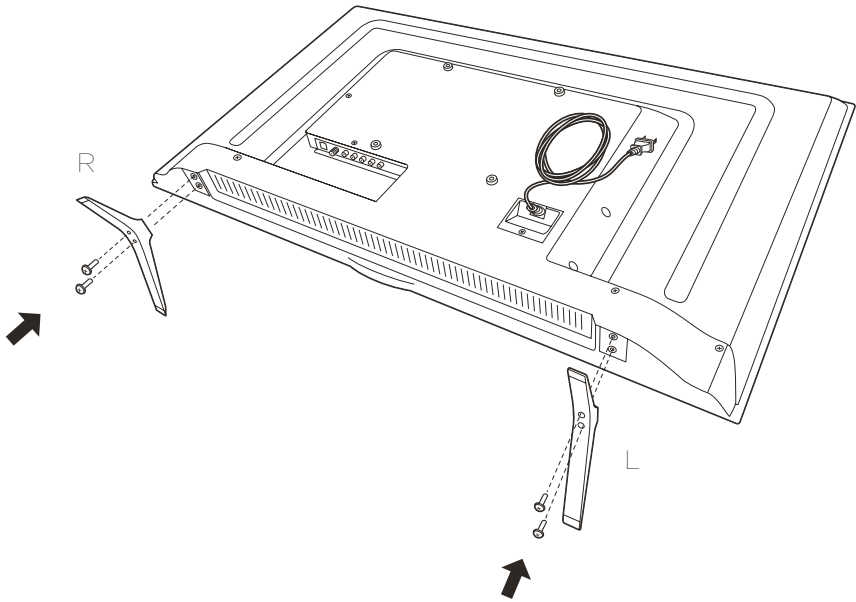

Installing the Stand



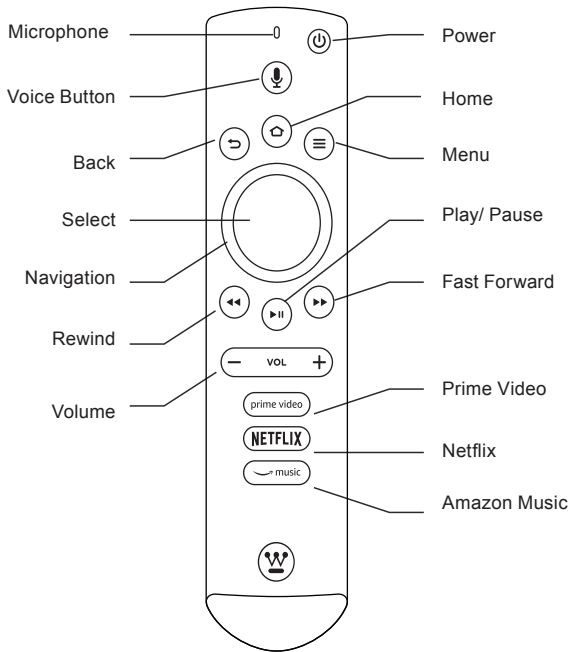
Securely attach the stands to your TV

Carefully remove the TV from the box and place it face down on a flat, soft surface to prevent any damage or scratches to the screen. You can also use the packaging material as a cushion between the surface and the screen. Align the stands with the screw holes on the base of the TV. Secure the stands to the TV using the included screws. Turn the TV upright and place it in the desired location.

Note:

If you plan to mount your TV on a wall, do not install the feet. Use the screw holes in the back of the TV to secure the TV to the wall mount per wall mount manufacturer's instructions.

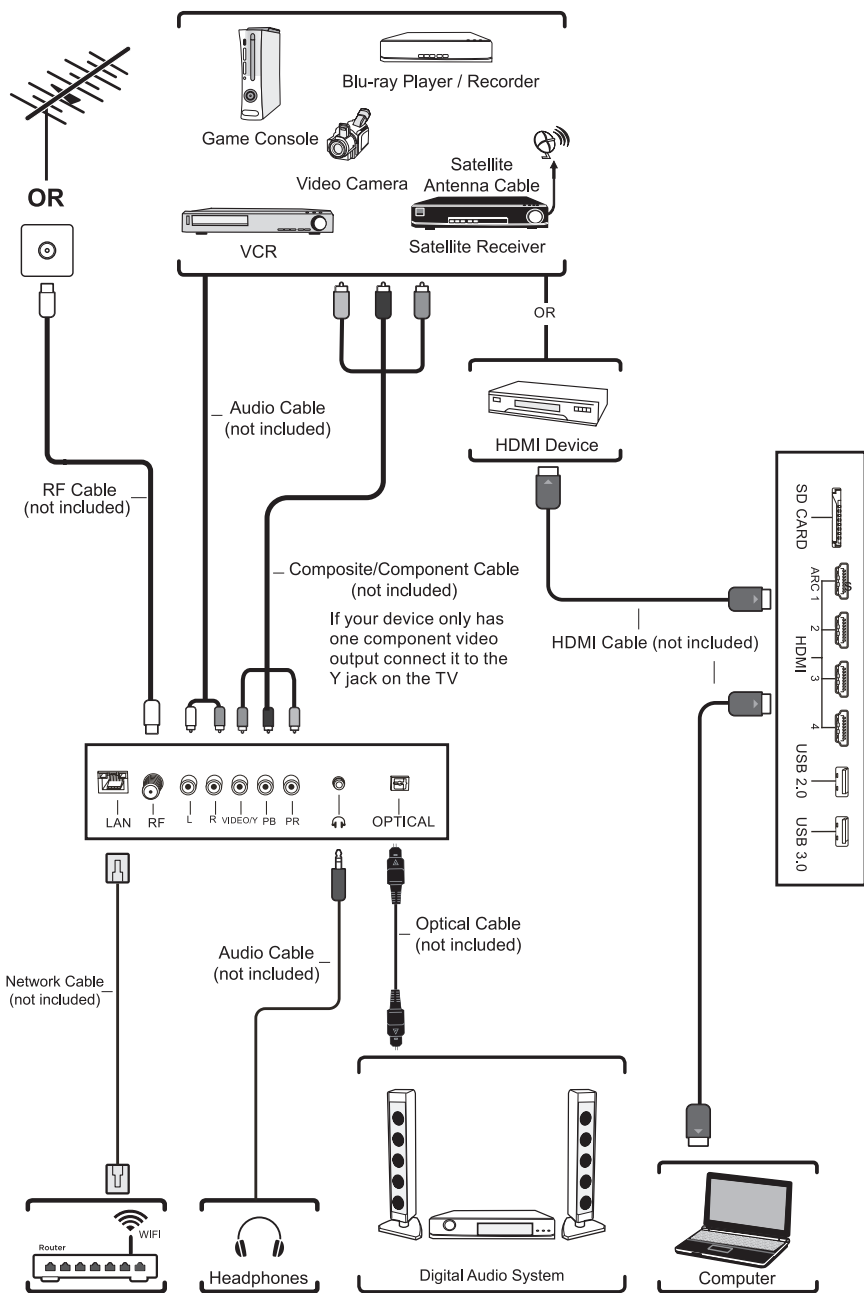

CONNECTING EXTERNAL DEVICES



SETUP

Once you've connected your devices to your television and plugged it in, insert the included AAA batteries into the back of the remote and press the  "power" button on the remote. Your television will start and after a few seconds you will be prompted to pair your remote with your television. Pairing your remote to your television is necessary because the remote uses Bluetooth to send most button commands and voice commands to your television.

If your television doesn't find your remote, remove and reinsert the batteries in your remote. The remote should automatically pair with your TV. If your remote still doesn't pair with your TV press and hold the  button on your remote for 10 seconds while your television is searching for your remote.

Once you've paired your remote, follow the on-screen instructions to set up your TV.

Connect your TV to the Internet and sign in with your Amazon account to use voice commands with your voice remote and to enjoy thousands of movies and TV episodes, songs, apps, and games on your TV.

If you want to add an antenna to receive over-the-air channels, please go to Settings → Inputs.

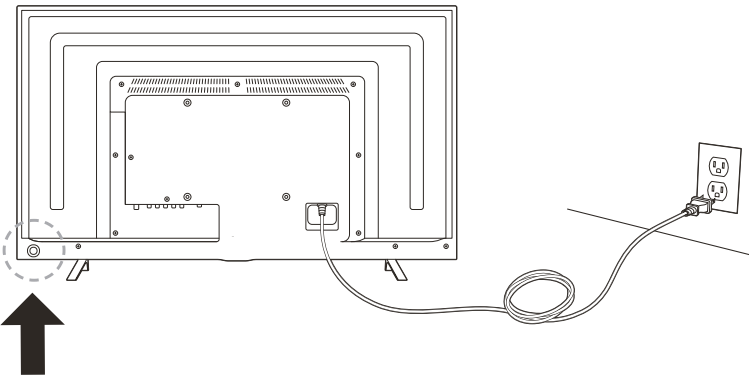

CUSTOMIZING TV SETTINGS


- The most common TV settings can be accessed by pressing the  icon for three seconds. After 3 seconds a menu will appear on the right side of the screen. Use the circular ring on the remote to navigate to the appropriate action.
- You can control your Westinghouse Fire TV Edition using the included remote, the Fire TV Remote app, or the directional controller on the back of the TV. Download the Fire TV Remote App to your iOS, Android or Fire OS device by visiting the appropriate app store for your device. The directional navigation controller is on the back of the TV as shown below.

Access to the channel guide only appears if you've connected an antenna and performed a channel scan. To initiate a channel scan go to Settings → Inputs → Antenna .

3. Apps

Navigate to your apps & games library

4. Sleep Timer

Sets a timer to automatically turn off the TV in the selected number of minutes.

5. Picture

Adjust picture settings for the current input, or Fire TV experience and apps

6. Sound

Adjust the sound settings for the selected input, or Fire TV experience and apps

Additional TV Settings can be found by navigating to Settings on the Home Screen.

Add Bluetooth Remotes, Game Controllers, Headphones, Keyboards and Mice You can add compatible bluetooth game controllers, headphones, keyboards and mice in Settings → Controllers & Bluetooth Devices

Software Updates

Overview

Parental controls relating to over-the-air live TV content use the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) ratings classification system and the TV Guidelines Organization TV Parental Guidelines as the basis for its ratings categories. The V-Chip: Options to Restrict What Your Children Watch on TV

The V-chip allows parents or other caregivers to block programming on their TVs that they don't want children to watch. Most programs are assigned a rating based on parental guidelines established by the TV industry. The ratings provide information about the content and age-appropriateness of most TV programs, except news, sports and unedited movies on premium cable channels.

Parents can program the V-chip to block programs based on these ratings, which include two elements: an age-based rating that provides guidance about the age group for which a program is appropriate, and content descriptors indicating that a program may contain suggestive dialogue (D), coarse or crude language (L), sexual situations (S), or violence (V). The ratings are:

• TV Parental Guideline Rating System

Rating		Meaning
TV-Y	All Children	Programs aimed at a very young audience, including children from ages 2-6
TV-Y7	Directed to Older Children	Programs most appropriate for children age 7 and up.
TV-Y7-FV	Directed to Older Children	Programming with fantasy violence that may be more intense or more combative than other programming in the TV-Y7 category.
TV-G	General Audience	Programs suitable for all ages; these are not necessarily children's shows.
TV-PG	Parental Guidance Suggested	Parental guidance is recommended; these programs may be unsuitable for younger children.
TV-14	Parents Strongly Cautioned	These shows may be unsuitable for children under 14.
TV-MA	Mature Audience Only	These programs are intended to be viewed by mature, adult audiences and may be unsuitable for children under 17

Film Ratings, Motion Picture Association of America

The Classification and Rating Administration ("CARA") issues ratings for motion pictures exhibited and distributed commercially to the public in the United States, with the intent to provide parents information concerning the content of those motion pictures, to aid them in determining the suitability of individual motion pictures for viewing by their children. CARA will rate any motion picture at any time before or after it is exhibited or distributed in the United States.

Rating		Meaning
MV-G	General Audiences	General Audiences. For all ages.
MV-PG	Parental Guidance Suggested	Parental Guidance Suggested. Some material may not be suitable for children.
MV-PG13	Parents Strongly Cautioned	Parents Strongly Cautioned. Some material may be inappropriate for children under 13.
MV-R	Restricted	Under 17 requires accompanying parent or adult guardian.
MV-NC-17	No children under age 17	Adults only. Not suitable for 17 and under.

Note: The V-Chip will automatically block certain categories that are "more restrictive." If you block TV-Y category, then all the ratings in the TV Parental Guideline Rating System will be automatically blocked. Similarly, if you block TV-G category, then all the categories in the "young adult" will be blocked (TV-G, TV-PG, TV-14, and TV-MA).

TROUBLESHOOTING

If your TV does not operate normally or cannot be turned on, please check the following troubleshooting questions. Remember also to check any other connected electronic device, such as DVD or Blu-ray player to pinpoint the problem. The TV does not operate properly

The TV does not respond when pressing any buttons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The TV may freeze up during use. Disconnect the power cord from the power socket for a few minutes. Reconnect the power cord and try to operate it again as usual.
TV cannot be switched on	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check that the TV is connected to the power supply. Make sure all connected AV devices are switched off before switching on your TV.
The remote control does not work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check to see if there are any objects between the TV and the remote control causing an obstruction. Ensure that you are pointing the remote control directly at the TV. Install new batteries. Remove the batteries from your remote and reinsert to reinitiate pairing with your TV. Hold down the home button on your remote for 10 seconds. Your remote should be rediscovered within 60 seconds. Ensure that the batteries are installed with the correct polarity (+ to +, - to -).
Power is suddenly turned off	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check the power of the TV. The power supply maybe interrupted. Check if the sleep timer is set.

The video function does not work

No picture & No Sound	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check whether the TV is switched on. Try another channel. The problem may be caused by the broadcaster.
Picture appears slowly after switching on	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This is normal; the image is muted during the TV startup process. Please contact your service centre if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.
No or poor color or poor picture	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Adjust the settings in the PICTURE menu. Try another channel. The problem may be caused by the broadcaster. Check if video cables are connected properly.
Horizontal/Vertical bar or picture shaking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.
Poor reception on some channels	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The station or cable channel may be experiencing problems; tune to another station. Station signal may be weak, reposition the antenna for better reception. Check for sources of possible interference.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Lines or streaks in pictures	• Check antenna (change the position of the antenna.)
No pictures when connecting HDMI	• Check if the input source is HDMI1/HDMI2/HDMI3/HDMI4.
The audio function does not work	
Picture OK but no sound	• Press the VOL +/- buttons. • Sound muted? Press the Volume Up button. • Try another channel. The problem may be caused by the broadcaster.
No output from one of the speakers	• Adjust the Balance settings in the SOUND menu.

Maintaining

- Do not use your TV in areas that are too hot or too cold, because the cabinet may warp or the screen may malfunction. Your TV works best in temperatures that are comfortable to you.
- Storage temperatures are 32° to 122°F(0° to 50°C)
- Working temperatures are 32° to 95°F(0° to 35°C)
- Do not place your TV in direct sunlight or near a heat source
