1.4 Human Exposure Assessment Results

Calculation

$$\text{Given } E = \frac{\sqrt{30 \times P \times G}}{d} \quad \& \quad S = \frac{E^2}{3770}$$

Where E = Field Strength in Volts / meter

P = Power in Watts

G = Numeric antenna gain

d = Distance in meters

S = Power Density in milliwatts / square centimeter

Combining equations and re-arranging the terms to express the distance as a function of the remaining variables yields:

$$S = \frac{30 \times P \times G}{3770 d^2}$$

Changing to units of mW and cm, using:

$$P \text{ (mW)} = P \text{ (W)} / 1000 \text{ and}$$

$$d \text{ (cm)} = 100 * d \text{ (m)}$$

Yields

$$S = \frac{30 \times (P/1000) \times G}{3770 \times (d/100)^2} = 0.0796 \times \frac{P \times G}{d^2}$$

Where d = distance in cm

P = Power in mW

G = Numeric antenna gain

S = Power Density in mW / cm²

Given $E = \frac{\sqrt{30 \times P \times G}}{d} \quad \& \quad S = \frac{E^2}{3770}$	Where G: numerical gain of transmitting antenna; TP: Transmitted power in watt; d: distance from the transmitting antenna in meter
Max average output power in Watt (TP)	0.33dBm (0.00011W)
Antenna gain (G)	2dBi (Numeric gain:1.58)
Exposure classification	S=1mW/cm ²
Minimum distance in meter (d) (from transmitting structure to the human body)	20cm (0.2m)

Yields

$$S = \frac{30 \times P \times G}{3770 d^2}, \quad P=0.00011\text{W}, G=1.58, d=0.2$$

$$S=0.00035\text{mW}/\text{cm}^2$$

Or

$$d = \sqrt{\frac{30 \times P \times G}{3770 S}}, \quad S=1, P=0.00011\text{W}, G=1.58$$

$$d=0.0012\text{m}$$

Conclusion:

$S=0.00035\text{mW}/\text{cm}^2$ is significant lower than the General Population Exposure Power Density Limit $1\text{mW}/\text{cm}^2$ or except the distance when human body proximity to the antenna is less than 0.12 cm then will reach the General Population Exposure Power Density Limit

(For mobile or fixed location transmitters, the maximum power density is $1.0\text{mW}/\text{cm}^2$ even if the calculation indicates that the power density would be larger.)
