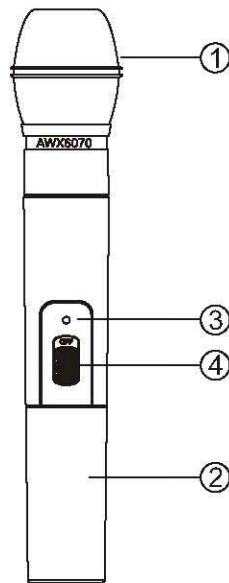


TRANSMITTER

LOCATION AND FUNCTION OF PARTS AND CONTROLS HANDHELD MICROPHONE (AWX6070)



1. Grille: Protects the cartridge and help reducing the breath sounds and wind noise.
2. Battery Cover: Open it to install the battery.
3. Low Battery Indicator: Red light glows when it is lack of power and should renew the battery.
4. Power and Audio Mute Switch.

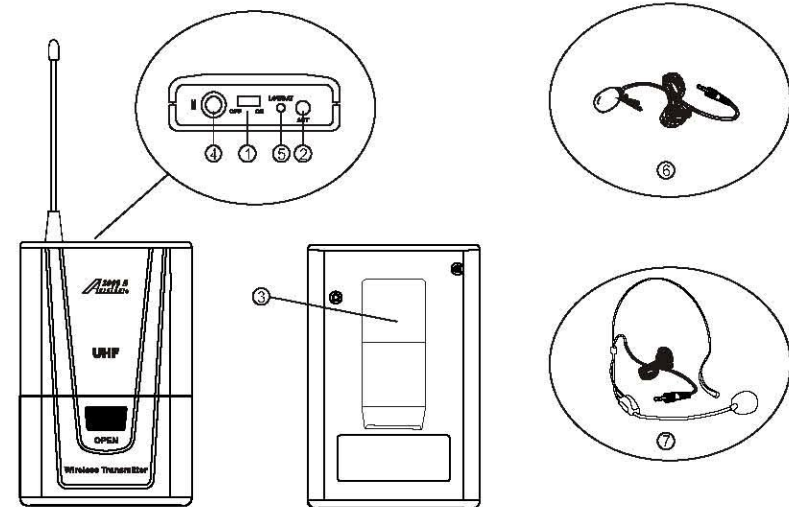

1. Power and Audio Mute Switch.
2. Antenna: Transmit the RF signal of transmitter.
3. Belt Clip: Attach the transmitter to the belt.
4. Audio Input Jack: it is suitable for lavalier system/headset system.
5. Low Battery Indicator: Red light glows when it is lack of power and should renew the battery.
