





Connect power



Prepare the remote control



To insert the remote control batteries:

- 1. Open the battery compartment.
- Insert 2 x AAA batteries with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated. The 2xAAA battery not include in our products, please purchase from Authorized Seller.
- 3. Close the battery compartment.

Please Note:

- •If you are not going to use the remote for a long time, remove the batteries.
- •Do not use old and new or different type of batteries in combination.

Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.

Turn On

- 1. Connect the AC power cable and plug to the wall socket;
- 2. Press the "POWER" button to the "ON" status to power on the speaker.

If you do not use this unit for a while, please switch the "POWER" button to "OFF" status, and disconnect the AC power cable of this unit.



AUX	Connect the AUX-IN Cable to the AUX Jack to connect to the external device.
USB/B INPUT 5V== 300mA	Connect to a USB storage device to playback your stored music.

BUITAR VOL	Turn the Guitar Volume knob to adjust the sound level of the Guitar.

Press MUSIC VOICE button again to turn off the function and music will return to original tone.

MIC VOICE +	Pressing this key once raises the voice tone of the microphone by one level, and the adjustment range is: P (-12)-0-(12), which is shown on the display; When operating this key, the key indicator flashes blue, and after stopping the operation 3S, the key indicator lights up in blue.

Tws	If you have two GPK-1000 speakers you may connect them wireless to enjoy stereo sound effect. (1) Power on both the speakers and switch in BT2 playback mode, before making a Bluetooth connection, press TWS button on either machine (it will become HOST machine and other machine will become secondary machine). The indicator light will blink White. (2) When the pairing is successful, speaker will prompt "TWS Connected" and the key indicator light on both machines will turn solid white. Display for the host speaker will show "bLUE" and on secondary speaker it will show "TWS". (3) Turn on your Bluetooth audio device and search LMGA24-B to make Bluetooth connection. Upon successful connection music will be played on both speakers simultaneously. (4) In TWS mode, use the function keys on HOST speaker to control. (5) Press TWS key on either speaker to disconnect TWS pairing.

Play from USB

Make sure that the USB storage device containers playable audio in supported MP3 format.

Instruction:

- 1.This speaker has two USB ports (USB-A port and USB-B port) located on top control panel of the speaker.
- 2.Press"F" button on the top control panel or "MODE" button on the remote control to select "USB1/USB2" and insert the USB, the unit will automatically read and play the music on the USB device.
- 3. Pressi or ▶ikey to select
- 4. Press ▶ key to play or pause

Important:

USB socket is only for music playing, not support charging.


USB memory device should be formated as FAT32.

5.Listen to radio

Turn on FM radio stations

Note

- Make sure that you have connected and fully extended the supplied FM antenna.
- 1. Insert the FM Antenna Cable into the FM Anternna Jack on the rear panel.
- 2.Press the "F" button on the Top Control or "MODE" button on the remote control to switch to FM mode.
- 3. Presss ► key on the Top Control or the "SEARCH" button on the remote control to search FM radio stations automatically.
- 4. Press or ▶ to select the previous or next radio station.



6.Connect with Bluetooth

- 1. Press the "BT" button on the Top Control panel or "MODE" or BT" on the remote control to switch to the BLUETOOTH CONNECT mode, (bT1 or bT2) will be displayed on the screen.
- Open the Bluetooth on the external device (must have Bluetooth function), and the name "GEMINI GPK-1000-A" or "GEMINI GPK-1000-B" will show on the device, please try to connect it.
- 3. Once connected, you can hear a small sound from the speaker.
- 4. You can use the I◄ or ► key on the Top Control panel to control the tracks of the external device.

Note: no password needed for connecting.

7. TWS Pairing

If you have two of these speakers (GPK-1000), you can use them together for a more immersive audio experience. To pair the two speakers:

- 1. Place both speakers within Bluetooth range of each other (in the same room).
- 2. Make sure both speakers are on BT2 mode, and press the TWS buttons on both speakers to activate TWS pairing mode.
- 3. The indicator light will blink White. When the pairing is successful, speaker will prompt "TWS Connected" and the key indicator light on both machines will turn solid white.
- 4. The main speaker will display "bLUE" and the second speaker will display" TWS".
- 5. Press the TWS button to disconnect the TWS pairing.


*Please disconnect if Bluetooth is in using, before activating TWS pairing.

*Some functions are not synchronized between the speakers.

8.Connect with Line-in

- 1.Press the "F" button on the Top Control panel or the "MODE" button on the remote control to switch to the Line-in mode, (AUX) will be displayed on the screen.
- 2. Connect an external audio source use a supplied line-in cable.
- 3. Once connected, turn on your external device music
- 4. Please control next or previous tracks from your external device.

Caution: Please trun off the party speaker before connect Line-in cable in order to avoiding unexpected noise.



9. Connect with Wired Microphone/Guitar



MIC1 MIC

Insert a 6.3mm wired microphone into either MIC1 or MIC2 to use the microphone function.





When playing with the wired microphone, please press this button and turn the main volume knob to adjust the Bass / Treble / Echo volume of the microphone.



When using the wired microphone, please turn these two rotary knobs to adjust the volume of the microphone.



When playing with the wired microphone, please press the PRIORITY button to activate the microphone priority function.



GUITAR

Insert a 6.3mm wired Guitar into Guitar Jack to use the Guitar function.



When using the wired Guitar, please turn this rotary knobs to adjust the volume of the guitar.

• Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the speaker again.

USB device not supported

- The USB device is incompatible with the unit. Try another one.

Bluetooth can not search or connect
