1.2. Standby Screen \& Icons

This phone provides multiple Standby screens. Through the instruction and various icons on the screen, you can have the operating information needed.



Insert the SIM card
Make sure that the clipped corner of the SIM card is facing the correct direction (iliped corner at bottom right) and the metallic contacts are facing downwards. Slide the SIM card into the card slot until it stops.


With the metallic contacts of the battery facing the metallic contacts in the battery lot, press the battery down until it locks into place.
Replace the back cover
Align and hook the back cover to the top of the battery slot and then push the cover upwards until it locks into place.
2.2. Inserting Micro SD card

2.3. Switch On/Off

2.4. Unlock SIM Card
o avoid illegal use, the SIM card is enciphered with PIN (personal identification mber) as a protection. When this function is ON and you have already set a PIN ode, you need to type in PIN code every time, the handset is switched on in order unlock SIM card and use the handset.
You can turn off the SIM PIN code. Yet in this situation, the SIM card can't prevent legal use.
hput PIN code, press arrowhead icon to erase typing error and delete them directly input again. For example, if the PIN code is set as 1234 , then type "1234" then ress Return.
The handset will inform you to type in PUK cod umbers) for your SIM provider will set a standard PIN code (four to eight personal code as soon as possible.
2.5. Connection to Network

When the SIM card is successfully unlocked, the handset will automatically search or available network (the lock screen shows searching). The handset will show the formation of the network provider; the status bar will show the signal strength and the network condition once the handset is successfully connected to a network. ote: If the lock screens shows "Emergency calls only", it means that youre out of emergency calls based on signal strength.

## .6. Charging the Battery

Ensure the battery inserted in the handset. To charge the battery, plug in the charger connector at the bottom of your phone (USB interface) and then plug the other end into an AC power socket.
The battery symbol indicates the charging status. While charging, the charge dicators will scroll. When all the scroll bars are steady, the battery is fully charged.
Disconnect the charger from the phone.

Emergency Calls

You can call for emergency service as long as you are in the network coverage heck the signal strength indication bar on the upper right side of the handset creen). If your network provider doesn't provide roaming service in this area, there will be "Emergency Calls" on the lock screen. If you are in the network coverage, you can have emergency calls even without a SIM card.

Drag the icon to answer an incoming call. If your headphone is connected to the
