The use of a permanently attached antenna or of anantenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator, the manufacturer may design the unit so that a broken antenna can be replaced by the user, but the use of a standard antenna jack or electrical connector is prohibited.





TEST PROCEDURE

- 1. The EUT was setup according to ANSI C63.10:2013 requirements.
- The EUT was placed on a platform of nominal size, 1 m by 1.5 m, raised 80 cm above the conducting ground plane. The vertical conducting plane was located 40 cm to the rear of the EUT. All other surfaces of EUT were at least 80 cm from any other grounded conducting surface.
- 3. The EUT and simulators are connected to the main power through a line impedances stabilization network (LISN). The LISN provides a 50 ohm /50uH coupling impedance for the measuring equipment.
- 4. The peripheral devices are also connected to the main power through a LISN. (Please refer to the block diagram of the test setup and photographs)
- 5. Each current-carrying conductor of the EUT power cord, except the ground (safety) conductor, was individually connected through a LISN to the input power source.
- 6. The excess length of the power cord between the EUT and the LISN receptacle were folded back and forth at the center of the lead to form a bundle not exceeding 40 cm in length.
- Conducted Emissions were investigated over the frequency range from 0.15MHz to 30MHz using a receiver bandwidth of 9 kHz.
- 8. During the above scans, the emissions were maximized by cable manipulation.

TEST PROCEDURE

- 1) The EUT was setup and tested according to ANSI C63.10:2013 for compliance to FCC 47CFR 15.247 requirements.
- 2) The EUT is placed on a turn table which is 1.5 meter above ground. The turn table is rotated 360 degrees to determine the position of the maximum emission level.
- 3) The EUT waspositioned such that the distance from antenna to the EUT was 3 meters.
- 4) The antenna is scanned from 1 meter to 4 meters to find out the maximum emission level. This is repeated for both horizontal and vertical polarization of the antenna. In order to find themaximum emission, all of the interface cables were manipulated according to ANSI C63.10:2013 on radiated measurement.
- The receiver set as follow: RBW=1MHz, VBW=3MHz PEAK detector for Peak value. RBW=1MHz, VBW=3MHz RMS detector for Average value.
