
POWERING ON THE KEY FINDER

Power On: Press and hold the power button for 4 seconds until you hear 2 "beeps"

Power Off: Press and hold the power button for 4 seconds until you hear a long beep.

NOTE: You must disconnect your key finder from your smart phone before you turn it off.

CONNECTING TO THE KEY FINDER



- 2. Download and install the "GoFinder" app on your smart phone and open the app.
- 3. Click the "+" button to search for connectable tags.
- 4. Search for "VAU-BTKEY" in the device list to connect it to

your smart phone. The tag will automatically connect to your phone the next time it's powered on and Bluetooth is enabled.

5. To edit the tag's display name, or delete the tag, slide left on the tag.

USING THE KEY FINDER

- 1. To locate a tag, open the "GoFinder" App and press "Alarm" on the tag you want to locate. Once you find it, press the "Alarm" button to turn off the alarm.
