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

# Frequency Response of E-Field (TEM-Cell: ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)





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# Receiving Pattern (Φ), θ=0°




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
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### Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>) (TEM cell, f = 900 MHz)





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
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




Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ±7.5% (k=2)

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### Receiving Pattern (Φ), θ=0°



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
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
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


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



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# Frequency Response of E-Field (TEM-Cell: ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)




Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ±7.5% (k=2)

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
# Receiving Pattern (Φ), θ=0°



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
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
