



Getting started:

Sherlock requires 3 x "AAA" 1.5V alkaline batteries. Remote requires 3 x "AAA" 1.5V alkaline batteries.

Batteries must only be fitted and removed by an adult.


Locate the battery compartment opening at the bottom of Sherlock and the remote. Using a suitable screwdriver remove the battery compartment lid.





Insert batteries per illustration. Ensure batteries are inserted using the correct polarity. Replace battery compartment cover and tighten screw. Ensure the plush fabric opening is securely closed.

Operation:

2 Players

Player 1: Hides Sherlock and uses the remote to give player 2 clues

Player 2: Listens to hear Sherlock's voice and follows the clues to find him

How to work Sherlock:

- Turn the switch to "ON" on the remote to activate the wireless function
- Turn the switch to "ON" on Sherlock and he will say: "Hi my name is Sherlock, let's play hide and seek together." The wireless function is now activated.
- Player 1 hides Sherlock.
- When Sherlock is ready and in his hiding place, press the button on the controller and he'll say "Come and Find Me". The motion sensor is now activated.
- Player 1 can give more clues by pressing the button on the remote to hear the below phrases:
 - o Where are you?
 - o Giggle
 - o Psst... I'm over here
 - o Keep Looking... you're getting closer!
 - o Barking
 - I love playing Hide and Seek
 - Are you sure you've looked everywhere because I'm still hiding?
 - I'm getting tired! Hurry up and find me!
 - o Snoring
- When Sherlock is picked up, the motion sensor will make him say "You found me, you're so clever! Let's play again! "

If Sherlock is idle for 5 minutes, he will go to sleep mode. Shake Sherlock to wake him up.
