

Maximum transmitter power:

Frequency (MHz)	Maximum peak output power (dBm)	Output power(mW)
2402	-1.86	0.65
2440	-2.38	0.58
2480	-3.08	0.49

According to KDB 447498 D01:

The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at test separation distances ≤50 mm are determined by:

[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW)/(min. test separation distance, mm)] $\cdot [\sqrt{f_{(GHz)}}] \le 3.0$ for 1-g SAR and ≤ 7.5 for 10-g extremity SAR,₂₄ where

- \bullet $f_{\text{(GHz)}}$ is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz
- Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation25
- The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison
- 3.0 and 7.5 are referred to as the numeric thresholds in the step 2 below

Result:

 $(0.65/5)*\sqrt{2.402} = 0.201 < 3.0$

 $(0.58/5)*\sqrt{2.440} = 0.181 < 3.0$

 $(0.49/5)^*\sqrt{2.480} = 0.154 < 3.0$

Conclusion:

No SAR is required.
