To avoid the side effects of electronic interference, turn off the headphone in the place where there is clear marks to ban the using of electronic products.

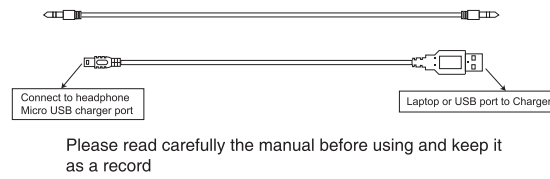
Civil aviation

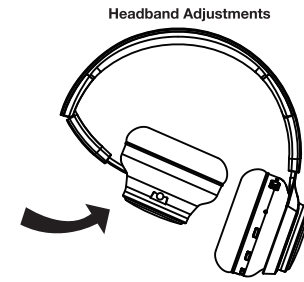

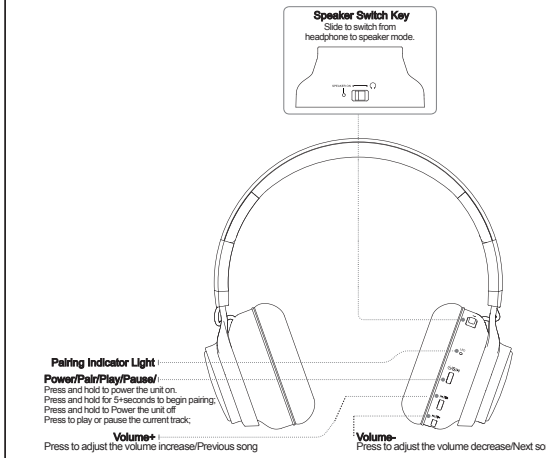
Introduction and Setup 3

Battery Power

1. Connect the included USB Cable to the USB Port of Computer or Adapter USB Port.
*Charge fully before use.
The indicator will display a red light when charging, and blue LED when fully charged.*

Operation 5

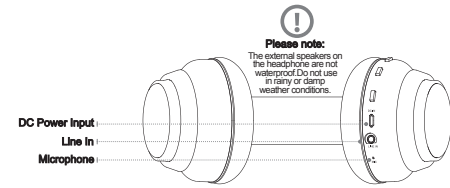
Power on: Press the power button 3_{sec} until blue LED on;
Power off : Press the power button 5_{sec} until red LED on;
Pairing: In the state of power off, press the power button about 5_{sec} until the blue and red LED glitters in turn;
Answering call: Press the power button to answer the phone call while in the conversation;
Ending call: Press the power button to end the phone call while in the conversation;
Rejecting call: Press and hold the power button for 2s to reject the phone call;

Redial the last call: Double click the power button, the headphone will dial last phone number remotely and automatically;

Volume Control: Under the music or conversation mode:
(1)Volume +: Press and hold the volume + (3~5s), the volume will increase gradually.
(2)Volume -: Press and hold the volume - (3~5s), the volume will decrease gradually.

Previous / Next:
In the state of music mode, press the volume + shortly (1s), then will go to previous song; press the volume - shortly (1s), then will go to next song

BLUETOOTH 9

Pairing a Bluetooth Device for the First Time

- 1.With the unit off, press and hold the Power/Pair/Play/Pause button for about 4s.The indicator will flash red and blue.When pairing, remain within 3 feet of the unit.
- 2.Using the native controls on your bluetooth device,select the BT-592 in your bluetooth setting to pair. If your device requests a password, enter the password 0000.

Refer to the user manual for your specific device for instructions on pairing and connecting bluetooth devices.After initial pairing,the unit will stay paired unless unpaired manually by the user or erased due to reset of the device;

Remarks: If your device should become unpaired or you find it is unable to connect,repeat the above steps;

BLUETOOTH 10

Playing music wirelessly

- 1.To play or pause a selected track,use the native controls on the connected bluetooth device or press the power/pair/play/pause button.
- 2.Audio played through the connected bluetooth device will now be heard through the headphones;

Using the Speaker phone

- 1.When a call is received, a ringtone will sound through the speakers.
- 2.Press the power/pair/play/pause button t accept the call or accept the call with the native controls on the connected device.
- 3.The incoming call received through the device will now be heard through the headphones.
- 4.To end a call, press the power/pair/play/pause button or end the call using the native controls on th connected device.

LINE IN 11

Using the audio input

Require a 3.5mm audio cable(included)

- 1.Connect a 3.5mm audio cable to the line in input on the unit and the audio output on an audio device.
- 2.Use the native device controls on the connected device to play your audio through the unit.

Note:The headphones do not have to be powered on to hear music through the line in input.Do this to conserve battery power;
