

## GETTING STARTED

### Turning the Tablet on and off


To turn the tablet on:

-Press and hold the **Power** key until the LCD screen turns on and you see NeuTab Logo, then wait until you see the Unlock screen.

To turn the tablet off:

1.Press and hold the **Power** key until the "turn tablet off" message appears.

2.Touch **OK** to turn off the tablet.

### Turning the Screen On and Off (Standby)

When the tablet is on, you can turn off the screen to conserve battery power. Simply press the **Power** key once to turn the screen off. Press the **Power** key again to turn the screen back on.

Tips: To conserve battery power, the screen can be set to turn off automatically when the tablet is not in use (between 15 seconds and 30 minutes). This Sleep option can be found in the Display menu.

### Unlocking the Screen

When the screen turns off, you will have to unlock the screen when you turn it back on.

To unlock the screen, touch and drag the **lock** icon to the edge of the circle that appears.

If a password has been set, enter the password to finish unlocking the screen. The Screen Unlock password can be set in the Security settings menu.

Warning: Please write down your password lock pattern/PIN/Password. Misplacing or forgetting this method will lock the user out. Recovering the unit will reset the device back to factory defaults.

### Your Tablet Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for all of the features of your tablet.

#### 1 Google Search

Touch to search with Google Search Engine.

#### 2 VOICE Search

Search by voice input.

#### 3 Home icon

Touch to back to the central Home Screen.

#### 4 Back icon

Touch to go back to the previous screen.

#### 5 Recent Apps

Touch to display the list of thumbnails of apps you have worked recently. Touch a thumbnail to open it.

#### 6 Applications Tab

Open the Application Launcher to view the list of all Applications and Widgets installed on the tablet. Touch the applications tab to open the Launcher.

#### 7 Icons

Touch an icon to open an application or application folder.

#### 8 Notification bar

Show notification icons and time, battery level, plus the network signal strength; touch the bar to open the full Notifications panel. Touch a Notification icon to display more detail.

### Default Applications

To open an application, touch the application icon on the home screen or in the applications menu.

## CONNECTING TO THE INTERNET

This tablet can utilize Wi-Fi data networks to connect to the Internet. Wireless Wi-Fi technology can provide Internet access at distances of over 300 feet; however, this distance can be affected by your surrounding environment and Wi-Fi router. In general, being closer to Wi-Fi router improve performance.

### Requirements

In order to connect to the Internet, you will need either of the following:

**A wireless router or access point with a broadband Internet connection**  
The tablet can receive 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi radio. The tablet will also work with wireless routers that only support 802.11 b/g.

You will need to know the **name of your network (SSID)**, as well as the password or other credentials if your network is secured. These settings can usually be found on the administration webpage of your wireless router.

**Tips:** You may encounter open Wi-Fi networks, or "hotspots". These networks are usually configured so that you can simply connect to them without needing to know its settings; the tablet will obtain all the information it needs from the router automatically.

**Warning:** Open Wi-Fi networks operates under the risk of information surveillance, your account information, especially password and other credentials might be audited by third parties. Please use caution when connected to open hotspots.

### Connect to a Wi-Fi network

The Notification bar displays icons that indicate your tablet's Wi-Fi status.

[Connected] Connected to a Wi-Fi network (waves indicate connection strength).  
[no icon] There are no Wi-Fi networks in range, or the Wi-Fi radio is off.




#### 2. Select an available Wi-Fi network to connect to:

In the same Wi-Fi settings menu above, touch a network in the list.

If the network is open, the tablet will prompt you to confirm connection to the network. Touch Connect to confirm.

If the network is secured (as indicated by a Lock icon), the tablet will prompt you to enter a password or other credentials. Touch the Wireless password box to show the on-screen keyboard and then use it to enter the password. Touch Connect to confirm.

When you have successfully connected to a Wi-Fi network, the Notifications bar at the bottom of the screen will show a Wi-Fi signal indicator.

## DOWNLOAD APPLICATIONS

This tablet is Google certified and has Google Play Store pre-installed. When connected to WiFi network, you can browse apps in Play Store and download/install them.


### The Play Store



## About the Touchscreen

Your tablet comes equipped with an easy-to-use touchscreen. Our capacitive multi-touchscreen requires gentle fingertip touch on the glass screen to activate tablet's functions.

Multiple fingers may be used to perform gestures (e.g. 2-finger picture zoom).

Please note: Your fingertips must not be covered. A stylus may be used. Make sure it is designed for capacitive touchscreens.

Tips: To avoid damaging the screen, do not touch it with excessive force or with any object other than your finger. For best response, make sure your hands are clean before using the touchscreen controls.

### Protective Film

A thin film has been applied to the touchscreen to protect it during shipping. The protective film should be removed before use. To remove it, simply take a corner of the film and peel it away from the screen.

## Charging the Tablet

Your NeuTab tablet comes with a built-in rechargeable lithium polymer battery.

**Before 1<sup>st</sup> time using the tablet, the battery should be charged fully to extend future battery life.**

To charge the battery:

1. Plug one end of the included power adapter into an AC 100-240V outlet.
2. Plug the other end of the included power adapter into the Power jack on the tablet.
3. Disconnect the power adapter when the tablet is fully charged.

Warning: The battery used in this device may present a fire or chemical burn if mistreated. Do not disassemble, incinerate, or heat the device. Do not leave the device in a place subject to direct sunlight, or in a car with its windows closed. Do not connect the device to a power source other than that which is indicated here on the label as this may result in the risk of fire or electric shock.

## Resetting/Restarting the Tablet

Reset the tablet if it should freeze and not respond or otherwise malfunction.

1. Disconnect your tablet if it is connected to a computer.
2. Press and hold the POWER key for about 10 seconds to turn off the tablet, and then press and hold the POWER key until you see NeuTab logo.

#### FCC Statement

Your wireless tablet is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The exposure standard for wireless tablet employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. \* Tests for SAR are conducted with the tablet transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the tablet is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output. Before a tablet model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model. The highest SAR value for this tablet when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.319W/Kg(Body-worn measurements differ among tablet models,
