Connection

NES/SNES/SFC Classic Edition (wireless connection)

- 1. Plug the 2.4G Retro Receiver into your NES / SFC / SNES Classic Edition.
- 2. Press START on your controller to connect to the Retro Receiver.
- 3. LED will be solid blue when connection is successful.
- Home Menu Access for NES/SNES/SFC Classic Edition SELECT + DOWN = RESET
- If connection is lost or you wish to pair with a new retro receiver, press and hold SELECT on the controller for 3 seconds. Blue LED will rapidly blink and be solid blue when connection is successful.
